A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$15,100 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998, for the purpose of funding the participation of a FSM delegation in the consultation meeting with the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child, scheduled to be held in Geneva in January 1998, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. The sum of \$15,100 or so much thereof as may
- 2 be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of
- 3 the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
- 4 September 30, 1998, for the purpose of funding the
- 5 participation of a FSM delegation in the consultation meeting
- 6 with the United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child,
- 7 scheduled to be held in Geneva in January 1998, for the purpose
- 8 of reviewing the FSM National Report on its implementation of
- 9 the Convention of the Rights of the Child over the last two
- 10 years.
- 11 Section 2. All funds appropriated by this act shall be
- 12 allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in
- 13 accordance with applicable law, including, but not limited to,
- 14 the Financial Management Act of 1979. The allottee of the
- 15 funds appropriated under Section 1 of this act shall be the
- 16 President of the Federated States of Micronesia. The allottee
- 17 shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much
- 18 thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose
- 19 specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in
- 20 excess of the sum appropriated. The authority of the allottee
- 21 to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of
- 22 September 30, 1998.
