A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 40 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 6-30, 6-44, 6-45, 8-21, and 8-132, by amending sections 102 and 113, as established by Public Law No. 8-132, to amend the title and definition of Chief State School Officer; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONSIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 102 of chapter 1 of title 40 of the
- 2 Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as established by
- 3 Public Law No. 8-132 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "Section 102. <u>Definitions</u>. As used in this act:
 - (1) 'Accreditation' means the process of evaluating a school in terms of meeting the required minimum standards and the acknowledgment thereof by the FSM National Government through the issuance of an FSM Certificate of Accreditation.
 - (2) 'Board of Education' means each of the four groups of persons having managerial, supervisory, or advisory powers concerning education, as created, appointed and confirmed in office by the duly elected officials of the States of Chuuk, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Yap.
 - (3) 'Chief \$thte School Officer' means the

 President of the College of Micronesia FSM and the

 State Director of Education or other highest ranking
 educator with day-to-day administrative authority and
 control over the educational system of each State.
 - (4) 'Children with disabilities' means those individuals from birth through age 21 who are evaluated as having mental retardation, hearing impairments including deafness, speech or language impairments, visual impairments including blindness,

1	serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic
2	impairments, autism, traumatic brain injury, other
3	health impairments, specific learning disabilities,
4	deaf-blindness, or multiple impairments, and who,

13	the FSM or abroad.
14	(16) 'Preschool' means any nursery school,
15	kindergarten or special program attended by children
16	during the period from infancy to age five or six,
17	preceding attendance at elementary school.

7	other services necessary to assist children with
8	disabilities. Special education is specifically
9	designed instruction, at no cost to the parents, to
10	meet the unique needs of a child with a disability,
11	including instruction conducted:
12	(a) in classrooms;
13	(b) in the home;
14	(c) in hospitals and institutions;
15	(d) in other settings; and
16	(e) in physical education.
17	(22) 'State' means a State within the Federated
18	States of Micronesia.
19	(23) 'State Director of Education' means the
20	individual who is appointed by the Governor of the
21	State and granted thereby the direct authority to
22	manage and control the daily affairs of the State
23	Department of Education.
24	(24) 'Teacher' means a classroom instructor who
25	has attained the FSM National Government teacher

1	certification standards and whose primary function is
2	to impart knowledge to students in schools.
3	(25) 'Teacher certification' means the issuance
4	of a certificate to a preschool, elementary, or
5	secondary classroom instructor who has met the
6	National Government qualification requirements set
7	forth in section 105 of this title."
8	Section 2. Section 113 of chapter 1 of title 40 of the
9	Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as established by
10	Public Law No. 8-132, is hereby amended to read as follows:
11	"Section 113. <u>FAC\$SO</u> .
12	(1) The FSM Department of Education will
13	periodically as necessary convene meetings of the
14	Chief Bk/dt/e School Officers for the purpose of
15	increasing cooperation and coordination between the
16	States and National Government and ensuring quality
17	educational programs and facilities for students, in
18	the following areas:
19	(a) Setting and attaining minimum
20	standards for educational administration, programs
21	and facilities;
22	(b) Obtaining and equitably distributing
23	national and external financial assistance for
24	education;
25	(c) Providing technical assistance to the

States and sharing experience and data on how to 1 improve the administration of educational programs; 2 and 3 Anticipating and meeting the needs of FSM students in the area of post-secondary education. 5 The Secretary of Education and the £bux Chief State School Officers, when meeting in their official capacity, shall be known as the FSM 8 Association of Chief \$tbt/d School Officers, or 9 FAC\$SO. 10 Upon discussing and reaching a consensus on (3) 11 educational issues, FAC\$SO shall formally adopt, in 12 the form of resolutions, its findings and 13 conclusions, as well as the reasons or principles 14 upon which its resolutions are based. 15 (4) The Secretary of Education shall promptly 16 transmit FAC\$SO resolutions to the FSM President and 17 to other persons as appropriate. 18 The Secretary of Education shall maintain a 19 book of FACSSO resolutions arranged consecutively 20 according to date of adoption, and indexed according 21 to subject matter." 22 23 24
