A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate the sum of \$25,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999, for the purpose of purchasing air-conditioners and refractometers for emergency crash, fire and rescue vehicles for the Federated States of Micronesia international airports, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. The sum of \$25,000, or so much thereof as may be
- 2 necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the
- 3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September
- 4 30, 1999, for the purpose of purchasing air-conditioners and
- 5 refractometers for the emergency crash, fire and rescue vehicles
- 6 purchased with the funds appropriated by Public Law No. 10-21.
- 7 Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date.
- 8 (1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,
- 9 managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with
- 10 applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial
- 11 Management Act of 1979. The allottee of the funds appropriated by
- 12 this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of Transportation,
- 13 Communication and Infrastructure for the Federated States of
- 14 Micronesia. The allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that
- 15 these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely
- 16 for the purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are
- 17 incurred in excess of the sum appropriated.
- 18 (2) The authority of the allottee to obligate funds
- 19 appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 2000.
- 20 Section 3. This act shall become law upon approval by the
- 21 President of the Federated States of Micronesia of upon its becoming

22 law without such approval.
