Dear Speaker Figir:



I am transmitting the following Congressional Act back to Congress which I have approved to become Public Law No. 16-31.

Congressional Act No. 16-33, "AN ACT TO AMEND THE REVISED NATIONAL ELECTION ACT OF 2005 BY AMENDING SECTIONS 503 AND 602 OF TITLE 9 OF THE CODE OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, AS AMENDED, TO REQUIRE THAT THE PRINTING OF BALLOTS BE COMPLETED NO LATER THAN 70 DAYS BEFORE A GENERAL ELECTION, TO INCREASE THE PERIOD FOR REQUESTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT BY MAIL FROM 120 DAYS TO 150 DAYS PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY, TO PROVIDE FOR A DEFINITE TURN AROUND PERIOD FOR THE MAILING BACK OF ABSENTEE BALLOTS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

This Congressional Act was the result in part of the C.B. No. 16-62 which originated from the Executive. I certainly appreciate the efforts by you and your honorable colleagues on this matter. The amendments introduced in this Act consist of certain amendments to the Revised National Election Act of 2005, as amended, in particular section 503, upon the initiative of Congress, and of section 603, as proposed by the Executive in C.B. No. 16-62.

Section 503, title 9 of the FSM Code provides that the National Election Director shall print sample ballots for distribution at least 55 days before a general election. The law further provides that the printing of official ballots (final form) must be completed no later than 55 days prior to the day of election.

The Act amends the current law, by expanding the period for the printing of sample ballot, from 55 days, to 65 days prior to a general election. As for the (final) official ballot, the printing shall be completed no later than 60 days, instead of 50 days, prior to the day of national election.

Another amendment concerns section 603. The law currently provides that the filing of application for absentee ballot by mail shall be received by the national election commissioner not more than 150 days but not less than 40 days before Election Day. The Act modifies the period by extending the submission of the request application to 160 days but not less than 40 days before Election Day. The intent of the amendment is to ensure a better turnout of voters during the next national election in March 2011.

The Act constitutes a substantial improvement to the present election statute. But given the multitude of challenges faced by the election system, we can further improve the statutory guidelines in the conduct of elections, in the pursuit of our mutual objective on encouraging more citizens to actively participate in the process of selecting the leaders of our Nation. Hence, I intend to submit further amendments to the present election law for your consideration during the next sessions of Congress. Some of these amendments include further increasing the periods for acceptance of requests for absentee ballot in order to achieve a much improved turnout of votes during national elections.

On the other hand, a discrepancy exists between the title of the Congressional Act, which states that the printing of ballots shall be completed no later than 70 days before a general election, and a section thereof which states a different period. As we both know, section 21, article IX of the Constitution requires that a bill may embrace but one subject expressed in its title. In this case, a legal ambiguity arises from the conflicting texts contained in the same Congressional Act. Nevertheless, in the interest of continued collaboration and more constructive engagement between our two branches of government to achieve our mutual objective of improving the present election system, I have decided to sign the Act to become law, but with reservations as explained above. The Executive Branch will take an initiative in addressing the reservations expressed herein by submitting further legislative measures for Congressional action.

AN ACT

To amend the Revised National Election Act of 2005 by amending sections 503 and 602 of title 9 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, to require that the printing of ballots be completed no later than 70 days before a general election, to increase the period for requesting an absentee ballot by mail from 120 days to 150 days prior to election day, to provide for a definite turn around period for the mailing back of absentee ballots, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- Section 1. Section 503 of title 9 of the Code of the
- 2 Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law
- 3 No. 14-76, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 4 "Section 503. Printing and distribution of ballots.
- 5 (1) The ballots shall be printed by order of the
- 6 National Election Director at the expense of the
- 7 Federated States of Micronesia. The National
- 8 Election Director shall complete the printing of
- 9 the official ballots no later than 60 days before a
- general election, or no later than 35 days before a
- special election. Ballots shall be consecutively
- 12 numbered. Under the direction of the National
- 13 Election Director, the national election
- 14 commissioners shall deliver adequate numbers of
- ballots to each polling place.
- 16 (2) At least 65 days before a general election,

1	and at least 40 days before a special election, the
2	National Election Director shall print a sample
3	ballot and shall forthwith submit copies of the
4	same to the national election commissioners for
5	distribution to the members of the several election
6	boards and to the several candidates at their
7	addresses as given on their nomination papers, and
8	the national election commissioners and election
9	board member shall post a copy of the same in a
10	conspicuous place in their office or a public
11	place."
12	Section 2. Section 602 of title 9 of the Code of the
13	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law
14	No. 14-76, is hereby further amended, to read as follows:
15	"Section 602. Voting absentee ballot by mail.
16	(1) Any Registered Voter who will be outside his or
17	her State of registration on Election Day may vote
18	absentee ballot by mail.
19	(2) Deadlines for submitting requests to vote
20	absentee ballot by mail.
21	(a) In the case of a general election, the
22	request to vote absentee ballot by mail, using the forms
23	required by the rules and regulations promulgated
24	pursuant to this title, must be received by the national
25	election commissioner of the State in which the voter is

registered not more than 150 days but not less than 40 days before Election Day.

- (b) In the case of a special election, the request to vote absentee ballot by mail must be received by the national election commissioner of the State in which the voter is registered not more than 50 days but not less than 35 days before the day of the special election.
- (c) If the absentee voter currently resides in a foreign country where the Federated States of Micronesia maintains an embassy or consulate, then a request to vote absentee ballot by mail may alternatively be sent to the embassy or consulate, which shall then forward a copy of the request to the National Election Director, or his or her designee, for verification and processing. The absentee voter shall indicate on the request form whether he or she intends to pick up his or her absentee ballot at the embassy or consulate.
- (d) The voter is solely responsible for ensuring that the request to vote absentee ballot by mail is received by the deadline. Delayed and lost mail for absentee ballot requests shall not create any obligation of the National Election Director or the national election commissioner to provide absentee ballots at any time after the time periods set forth herein have

expired.

- (e) Upon receipt of a request to vote absentee ballot by mail, the name of the requester and the time and the date of receipt of the request must be recorded. The national election commissioner, shall, no later than 2 days from receipt of the request, act on the request and mail back to the requester an absentee ballot provided that printed ballots are already available. printed ballots are not available at the time a request is received, the name of the requestor and the time and date of receipt of the request must still be recorded, and an absentee ballot shall be mailed to the requester no later than 5 days after the printing of ballots has been completed. Absentee voters who have indicated on their request forms that they intend to pick up their absentee ballot at an embassy or consulate shall retrieve their ballot from the embassy or consulate. The National Election Director shall provide sufficient absentee ballots to the embassy or consulate 10 days before a National election.
- (f) The National Election Director, or his or her designee, shall strike out or delete the entry of the absentee voter on the Signature List for that voter's regular Polling Place. The absentee voter shall not be allowed to cast a ballot at his or her regular

1 Polling Place on Election Day.

- (3) Marking and returning of absentee ballots by mail.
- (a) An absentee ballot by mail shall include the following parts: an official ballot, a ballot envelope, an affidavit prescribed by the National Election Director, and a covering reply envelope.
- (b) The absentee voter shall mark the ballot in the usual manner provided by law and in such manner that no person can see or know how the ballot is marked. The absentee voter shall then deposit the ballot in the envelope and securely seal the same. The absentee voter shall then complete and execute the affidavit. The ballot envelope and the affidavit shall then be enclosed and sealed in the covering reply envelope.
- (c) Absentee ballots and affidavits must be received by the national election commissioner of the State issuing the absentee ballot no later than the established closing hour of the Polls on Election Day. If an absentee voter resides in a foreign country where the Federated States of Micronesia maintains an embassy or consulate, and the absentee voter had submitted his or her request to vote absentee ballot to that embassy or consulate, then the absentee voter may alternatively deliver his or her absentee ballot and affidavit to that

embassy or consulate. The absentee ballot and affidavit must be received by the embassy or consulate no later than the established closing hour of the Polls on Election Day.

- (d) Absentee ballots received at a post office in the Federated States of Micronesia on Election Day shall be stamped with the time and date of their receipt.
 - (4) Disposition of absentee ballots by mail.
- (a) Upon the receipt of an absentee ballot, the national election commissioner, or his or her appointee, shall open it, remove the ballot envelope, and examine the affidavit. If the national election commissioner or his or her appointee determines that the absentee ballot is valid, the ballot envelope shall be deposited unopened in a container retained for that purpose. container shall be securely sealed except for an opening sufficient to permit deposit of ballot envelopes and shall be marked with the name and official title of the national election commissioner, or his or her appointee, and the words, 'This container holds absentee ballots and must be opened only pursuant to law.' The national election commissioner, or his or her designee, shall safely keep each container secured in the commissioner's office until Election Day.

1	(b) On Election Day, the national election
2	commissioner, or his or her designee, shall open the
3	container, extract and segregate the ballot envelopes,
4	and deliver such envelopes to the counting and
5	tabulation committee. Each candidate, or his or her
6	representative, shall have the opportunity to be present
7	during this process.
8	(c) An absentee ballot may be determined to be
9	invalid if:
10	(i) the affidavit is found to be
11	insufficient;
12	(ii) the signatures on the request for the
13	ballot and the affidavit do not correspond;
14	(iii) the request for the ballot was not
15	properly made or was untimely, as set forth in this
16	section;
17	(iv) the ballot was not returned in a timely
18	fashion, as set forth in this section;
19	(v) the ballot was returned in a bundle
20	with other ballots;
21	(vi) the voter is not qualified to vote;
22	(vii) the voter is not registered to vote;
23	(viii) the ballot envelope is open or has been
24	opened and resealed; or
25	(ix) the voter has already voted.

1	(d) The ballot envelope of an invalid absentee
2	ballot shall not be opened and the national election
3	commissioner or his appointee shall mark across its face
4	'Rejected,' and write the reason for the rejection, and
5	shall preserve the same in the manner and for the period
6	of time required under this title for regular ballots
7	cast in an election. At the end of this time period,
8	the invalid absentee ballots shall be destroyed without
9	being opened in the manner provided under this title."
10	Section 3. Effective Date. This act shall become law upon
11	approval by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or
12	upon its becoming law without such approval.
