Dear Speaker Figir:

I hereby return the following congressional act which I have grudgingly signed to become Public Law No. 17-34, with great reservations and with numerous item vetoes:

Congressional Act No. 17-33, "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$2,100,000 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2012, FOR THE PURPOSE OF FUNDING PUBLIC PROJECTS AND SOCIAL PROGRAMS IN THE STATES OF YAP, KOSRAE, POHNPEI AND CHUUK, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I explain in this communication the reservations I have and the dilemma that I find myself in as I deliberated on the subject. The mathematical discrepancy in the bill made the review much more difficult, and I hope that Congress will address this soon. At the outset, allow me to reiterate that I do not oppose public projects in general. In fact, I commend the States of Yap¹ and Kosrae for funding meaningful capital projects. What I personally oppose are public expenditures that have little impact or no contribution at all to the welfare of our constituents, such as travel funds. I also believe that appropriations for public projects and social programs must be made transparent. In this case, there are no inputs from the executive branch, and the appropriation bill was not open to public hearing, yet the President is designated as the allottee of many of these public projects. At the very least, the President should have been heard on his views regarding the validity of these projects/programs. More so, there are weak links between these public projects and social programs and the Strategic Development Plan (SDP) of the nation.

Appropriation for public project such as this act raises false hope on our people, and it builds public appetite to demand for more projects that are lacking in substance. Clearly, there are no set rules, procedures, guidelines or policies to implement these projects. For example, fishing projects, farming projects, sewing projects, and low income subsidy are among the nebulous line items in relatively small amounts that will benefit only a few individuals.

On Yap Catholic High School construction, I would have preferred that this be made more neutral to accommodate Christian groups other than Catholic.

On the other hand, the congressional act strengthens JEMCO's argument that FSM fails to plan, and that it fails in exercising fiscal responsibility. Public projects must be anchored on coherent plan such as the SDP which contributes to the economic well-being of the nation. For this reason, I disapproved travels, subsidies and other expenditures for operation of election districts for being vague, duplicitous and unnecessary.

In view of the foregoing discussions and observations, I have vetoed the following line items:

#### AN ACT

6	Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
7	date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted,
8	managed, administered and accounted for in accordance with
9	applicable laws, including, but not limited to, the Financial
10	Management Act of 1979. The allottee shall be responsible for
11	ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
12	necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in this
13	act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum
14	appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated under
15	sections 2 through 5 of this act shall be the President of the
16	Federated States of Micronesia, EXCEPT THAT the allotee of
17	funds appropriated under section 2 of this act shall be the
18	Governor of Yap State, the allottee of funds appropriated under
19	subsections 4(3) (a) and (b) shall be the Pohnpei
20	Transportation Authority, the allottee of funds appropriated
21	under subsection 5 (1) shall be the Governor of Chuuk State,
22	the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) shall
23	be the Mortlock Islands Development Authority and the allottee
24	of funds appropriated under subsection 5(6)(f) shall be the
25	President of COM-FSM. The authority of the allottee to

2	September 30, 2014.
