The following Congressional Act, which became Public Law No. 19-76, is approved, however with line-item vetoes.

Congressional Act No. 19-74, entitled "AN ACT TO FURTHER AMEND PUBLIC LAW NO. 18-117, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 18-120, 19-04, 19-08, 19-35, 19-49 AND 19-59, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 2 AND 5 THEREOF, TO CHANGE THE USE OF FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED THEREIN, FOR PURPOSE OF FUNDING PUBLIC PROJECTS AND SOCIAL PROGRAMS FOR THE PEOPLE OF THE STATES OF YAP AND CHUUK, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

The line item vetoes are based on findings of the Department of Finance and Administration that there is insufficiency of funding to accommodate the proposed changes to Section 5 of Public Law No. 18-117.
