Dear Speaker Simina:

I am transmitting the following congressional act as Public Law No. 19-173, with item vetoed for reasons explained in this transmittal:

Congressional Act No. 19-167, entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND PUBLIC LAW 19-54 AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 19-62, P.L. 19-75, P.L. 19-79, P.L. 19-99, P.L. 19-119, P.L. 19-129, P.L. 19-136 AND P.L. 19-144, IN ORDER TO AMEND SECTION 4 AND SECTION 5 THEREOF, TO CHANGE THE USE OF FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED THEREIN, TO FUND PUBLIC PROJECTS AND SOCIAL PROGRAMS IN THE STATES OF POHNPEI AND CHUUK, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES".

I regret to inform you that the following items are being vetoed for reason's which lacks funding to accommodate changes in use of funds as stated in this Act.

- Line 8 on page 5, item (h) for project entitled "Contribution to state, municipal and 1. community activities, programs and event" in the amount of \$37,800 dollars is VETOED for reasons of insufficient funding.
- Line 16 on page 5, item (1) for project entitled "Leadership, Patient, Constituency COAP 2. travel" in the amount of \$39,560 dollars is VETOED for reasons of insufficient funding.

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 19-54, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 19-62, 19-75, 19-79, 19-99, 19-119, 19-129, 19-136, and 19-144, by amending sections 4 and 5 thereof, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, to fund public projects and social programs in the states of Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.
