CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION NO. 1-22, CD1

## A RESOLUTION

Strongly urging the United States Government to concel any plans it may currently have, as well as any plans it may be developing, relative to the storage or disposal of nuclear wastes in the Pacific Basin.

- 1 WHEREAS, the State Department of the United States Coverament has recently
- 2 made public the initiation of negetiations with the Japanese Government
- 3 regarding the possibility of storing nuclear vastes on an Azerican-owned
- 4 island in the Pacific Basin: and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Pacific Basin has already been the site of extensive
- 6 simpspheric nuclear testing which has released massive encounts of redicactive
- 7 restorial into the atmosphere and adjacent escan areas, as well as onto
- 8 Islands in the area, thereby giving the peoples of both the North and South
- 9 Pacific all too intimate experiences with mucleur energy, its by-products and
- 10 afteroffeets; and
- 11 WHEREAS, the people of Micronesia have witnessed the disasterous
- 12 impact that nuclear tosting conducted more than 3 decedes ago has had on
- 15 islands and large numbers of people in the Marchall Valands; and
- 14 MMREAS, the world-wide nuclear industry and the agencies and departments
- 15 of the United States Government, as well as other governments around the
- 16 world, have been unable to devolop a safe method for the storage or disposal
- 17 of medicar vastes on continental land masses; and
- 18 WHIREAS, it is the sense of the Congress that, until such time as a
- 19 fully effective and safe method for the storage or disposal of ausless wastes
- 20 has been developed and proven through a rigorouply thorough testing program.
- 21 At is incorrection to consider storing or disposing of such wastes in the
- 22 Pacific Basin as an expedient solution to a most difficult and perplening

1 problem; and MAMREAS, the delegates to the Micronesian Constitutional Convention of 3 1975, who drafted the Constitution of the Federated States of Micronesia, 4 placed strong restrictions on the testing, storage, use or disposal of 5 radioactive substances; now, therefore, BE IT RESOLVED by the First Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia, First Regular Session, 1979 that the United States Government be strongly urged to cancel any plans it may corrently have, as well as any plans it may be developing, relative to the storage or disposal of nuclear wastes in the Pacific Basin; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be 21 transmitted to the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the Prime Minister of Japan, the President of the United States, the Secretary of State, the Secretary of Energy, the Secretary of the Interior, the Director of the Office of Territorial Affairs, and the High Commissioner. 17 Adopted: June 14, 1979 19 20 21 22 23 24 25
