A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 22-60 and 22-80, to appropriate \$1,144,547 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2022, to provide additional funding for the operations of the Executive Branch of the National Government, operations for Postal Services and the National Election Office; Grants, Subsidies, and Contributions; and Capital and Human Resources Development; and for other purposes.
