

#### AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, and 9, of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221, 21-238 and 22-01, to appropriate \$556,536 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the Executive Branch; the Legislative Branch; Agencies, Boards, Authorities, and Commissions; Grants, Subsidies and Contributions; Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by
- 2 Public Laws Nos. 21-210, 21-221, 21-238, and 22-01, is hereby
