## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 104 of title 11 of the Code of the Pederated States of Micronesia, the National Criminal Code, by repealing subsection 6, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 104 of title 11 of the Code of the Federated
- 2 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
- "Section 104. <u>Definitions</u>. The definitions in this section shall apply throughout this code, unless otherwise specified or a different meaning is plainly required.
  - (1) Classification of crimes. A felony' is an offense which may be punished by amprisonment for more than one year.

    A 'petty misdemeanor' is an offense which may be punished by imprisonment for not more than thirty days. Every other offense is a 'misdemeanor.'
  - (2) Criminal negligence. A person acts with criminal negligence, or is criminally negligent, with respect to attendant circumstances when his conduct creates a substantial and unjustifiable risk and causes the criminal result; or if his failure to be aware of the risk constitutes a gross deviation from the standard of care that a reasonable person would exercise in the situation.
  - (3) Defendant. The term 'defendant' includes a person who is an accessory or accomplice of the defendant.
  - (4) Intent. A person acts incentionally, or with intent, with respect to his conduct or to a result thereof when it is his conscious purpose to engage in the conduct or cause the result.
  - (5) Knowledge. A person acts knowingly, or with knowledge, with respect to his conduct or to attendent circumstances when he is aware of the nature of his conduct or that those

circumstances exist. A person acts knowingly, or with knowledge, with respect to a result of his conduct when he is aware that his conduct is practically certain to cause the result.

- (76) <u>National offense</u>. A 'National offense' is an offense defined by this code or which is otherwise an offense against the Federated States of Micronesia
- proceeding heard or which may be heard before any legislative, judicial, administrative, or other governmental agency of the Federated States of Micronesia, or official authorized to take evidence under oath, including any referee, hearing examiner, commissioner, notary, or other person taking testimony or deposition in connection with any such proceeding. The term 'official proceeding' includes all judicial and administrative proceedings of the Government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands which arise out of the Federated States of Micronesia.
- (98) Recklessness. 'Racklessness' means to act with willful disregard to the attendant circumstances, or, if unaware of the circumstances, to act in such a manner that constitutes gross deviation from the standard of care that a reasonable person would exercise in the situation.

Persons. The terms 'persons,' 'he,' 'accused,' (109)1 and 'defendant' include any natural person and, where relevant, 2 a corporation or an unincorporated association. ż (7/10) Public servant. A 'public servant' means any officer 4 or employee of, or any person acting on behalf of, the Federated 5 States of Micronesia, including legislators and judges, and any 6 person acting as an advisor, consultant, or otherwise, in per-7 forming a governmental function; but the term does not include witnesses. The term 'public servant' includes a public servant 9 of the Government of the Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands 10 when acting in judicial or administrative proceeding which has 11 been brought in, or arises out of, the Federated States of Micro-12 13 nesia. (1211) State. The term 'State' means a State of the 14 Federated States of Micronesia." 15 Section 2.
