## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend titles 6, 10, 11, 18, 32, 52, 54 and 55 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia and Public Law No. 2-50 to correct certain errors therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 131 of title 6 of the Code of the Federated 1 2 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 131. Jurisdiction over acts of nonresidents. Any 3 person, corporation, or legal entity, whether or not a citizen or resident of the Trust Territory, who in person 5 or through an agent does any of the acts enumerated in this 6 subchapter, thereby submits himself or its personal 7 representative to the jurisdiction of the courts of the 8 Trust Territory as to any cause of action arising from: 9 (1) the transaction of any business within the Trust 10 Territory; 11 (2) the operation of a motor vehicle within the Trust 12 Territory; 13 (3) the optation of a vessel or craft 14 within the territorial waters or airspace of the Trust 15 Territory; 16 (4) the commission of a tortious act within the Trust 17 Territory; 18 (5) contracting to insure any person, property, or 19 risk located within the Trust Territory at the time of 20 contracting; 21 (6) the ownership, use, or possession of any real 22 estate within the Trust Territory; 23 (7) entering into an express or implied contract, by 24 25 mail or otherwise, with a resident of the Trust Territory

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1	to be performed in whole or in part by either party in th
2	Trust Territory;
3	(8) acting within the Trust Territory as director,
4	manager, trustee, or other officer of any corporation
5	organized under the laws of or having a place of business
6	within the Trust Territory, or as executor or administrat
7	of any estate within the Trust Territory;
8	(9) causing injury to persons or property within th
9	Trust Territory arising out of an act $\phi t$ or omission
10	outside of the Trust Territory by the defendant, provided
11	in addition, that at the time of the injury either:
12	(a) the defendant was engaged in the
13	solicitation or sales activities within the Trust
14	Territory/; or
15	(b) products, materials, or things processed,
16	serviced, or manufactured by the defendant anywhere were
17	used or consumed within the Trust Territory; and
18	(10) living in the marital relationship within the
19	Trust Territory notwithstanding subsequent departure from
20	the Trust Territory, as to all obligations arising for
21	alimony, child support or property rights under chapter 1
22	of this title, if the other party to the marital
23	relationship continues to reside in the Trust Territory."
24	Section 2. Section 703 of title 6 of the Code of the Federate
25	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:

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1	"Section 703. Extent of court's jurisdiction. The
2	jurisdiction of the court shall extend to any set-off,
3	affirmative defense, counterclaim, or other claim or demand
4	whatever pleaded by the National Government of the
5	Federated States of Micronesia, or other properly 10144
6	joined party to such action, against any plaintiff
7	commencing an action under this chapter."
8	Section 3. Section 301 of title 10 of the Code of the Federated
9	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
10	"Section 301. Statement of purpose. Micronesia became an
11	observer at the United Nations Law of the Sea Conference by
12	virtue of a resolution of the General Assembly of the
13	United Nations. As an observer, the Federated States of
14	Micronesia will be expected to participate fully in the
15	deliberations and proceedings of the conference and has
16	important interests to pursue in that #ptp forum. It is
17	therefore the sense of the Congress of the Federated States
18	of Micronesia that a joint delegation of the Federated
19	States of Micronesia to the United Nations Law of the Sea
20	Conference should be established to cooperate with the
21	executive branch of the Government of the Federated States
22	in formulating policy for the conference, to attend
23	sessions of the conference, and to participate in the
24	review and consideration of any treaties or international
25	agreements which are produced by the conference."

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1	Section 4. Section 917 of title 11 of the Code of the Federated
2	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"Section 917. Sexual abuse.
4	(1) <u>Sexual abuse</u> . A person commits the offense of
5	sexual abuse if he intentionally has sexual
6	contact with another person who is less than thirteen years
7	old or causes such a person to have sexual contact with him
8	(2) Definition. Sexual contact means any touching of
9	the sexual or other intimate parts of a person not
10	married to the defendant, done with the intent of
11	gratifying the sexual desire of either party.
12	(3) <u>Defense</u> . It is an affirmative defense that the
13	defendant reasonably believed the child to be older than
14	thirteen.
15	(4) A person convicted under this section shall be
16	punished by imprisonment for not more than five years."
17	Section 5. Section 921 of title 11 of the Code of the Federated
18	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
19	"Section 921. Kidnapping.
20	(1) A person commits the offense of kidnapping if he
21	unlawfully removes another from his pale place of
22	residence or business, or a substantial distance from the
23	vicinity where he is found, or if he unlawfully confines
24	another for a substantial period in a place of isolation,
25	with any of the following purposes:

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1	(a) to hold for ransom or reward, or as a shield
2	or hostage; or
3	(b) to facilitate commission of any felony or
4	flight thereafter; or
5	(c) to inflict bodily injury on or to terrorize
6	the victim or another; or
7	(d) to interfere with the performance of any
8	governmental or political function.
9	(2) A removal or confinement is unlawful under this
10	section if it is accomplished by force, threat, or
11	deception, or, in the case of a person who is under the age
12	of fourteen or incompetent, without the consent of a
13	parent, guardian, or other person responsible for general
14	supervision of his welfare.
15	(3) A person convicted under this section shall be
16	punished:
17	(a) by imprisonment for a maximum term of ten
18	years unless the person committing the offense voluntarily
19	releases the victim alive and in a safe place prior to
20	trial; or
21	(b) otherwise, by imprisonment for not more than
22	five years."
23	Section 6. Section 932 of title 11 of the Code of the Federated
24	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
25	"Section 932. Definitions. As used in this chapter:

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1	(1) 'Deprive' means:
2	(a) to withhold property of another permanent
3	permanently or for so extended a period as to appropriate a
4	major portion of its economic value, or with intent to
5	restore only upon payment of reward or other compensation;
6	or
7	(b) to dispose of the property so as to make it
8	unlikely that the owner will recover it.
9	(2) 'Financial institution' means a bank, insurance
10	company, credit union, building and loan association,
11	investment trust, or other organization held out to the
12	public as a place of deposit of funds or medium of savings
13	or collective investment.
14	(3) 'Government' means the Federated States of
15	Micronesia, and any department, agency, or subdivision
16	thereof, or any corporation or other association carrying
17	out the functions of Government.
18	(4) 'Movable property' means property, the location
19	of which can be changed, including things growing on,
20	affixed to, or found in land, and documents, although the
21	rights represented thereby have no physical location.
22	'Immovable property' is all other property.
23	(5) 'Obtain' means:
24	(a) in relation to property, to bring about a
25	transfer or purported transfer of a legal interest in the

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1	property, whether to the obtainer or another; or
2	(b) in relation to labor or service, to secure
3	performance thereof.
4	(6) 'Property' means anything of value, including
5	real estate, tangible and intangible personal property,
6	contract rights, choses-in-action, and other interests in
7	or claims to wealth, admission/ or transportation tickets,
8	captured or domestic animals, food and drink, electric or
9	other power.
10	(7) 'Property of another' includes property in which
11	any person other than the defendant has an interest which
12	the actor is not privileged to infringe, regardless of the
13	fact that the defendant also has an interest in the
14	property and regardless of the fact that the other person
15	might be precluded from civil recovery because the property
16	was used in an unlawful transaction or was subject to
17	forfeiture as contraband. Property in possession of the
18	defendant shall not be deemed property of another who has
19	only a security interest therein, even if legal title is in
20	the creditor pursuant to a conditional sales contract or
21	other security agreement."
22	Section 7. Section 934 of title 11 of the Code of the Federated
23	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
24	"Section 934. Theft by deception.
25	(1) A person commits theft if he purposely obtains

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1	property of another by deception. A person deceives if he
2	purposely:
3	(a) creates or reinforces a false impresssion,
4	including false impressions as to law, value, intention, or
5	other state of mind; but deception as to a person's
6	intention to perform a promise shall not be inferred from
7	the fact alone that he did not subsequently perform the
8	promise; or
9	(b) prevents another from acquiring information
10	which would affect his judgment of a transaction; or
11	(c) fails to correct a false impression which
12	the deceiver previously created or reinforced, or which the
13	deceiver knows to be influencing another to whom he stands
14	in a fiduciary or confidential relationship; or
15	(d) fails to disclose a known lien, adverse
16	claim, or other legal impediment to the enjoyment of
17	property which he transfers or encumbers in \$\phi\text{ph}\$
18	consideration for the property obtained, whether such
19	impediment is or is not valid, or is or is not a matter of
20	official record.
21	(2) The term 'deceive' does not, however, include
22	falsity as to matters having no pecuniary significance, or
23	puffing by statements unlikely to deceive ordinary persons
24	in the group addressed."
25	Section 8. Section 311 of title 18 of the Code of the Federated

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1 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 311. Definitions. As used in this chapter, the 2 following terms shall have the meanings respectively 3 ascribed to them in this section: 4 (1) 'Hovering vessel' means any unlicensed vessel 5 which is found or kept off any island, islet, atoll, or 6 reef of the Trust Territory, within the territorial waters 7 of the Trust Territory, if, from the history, conduct, character, or location of the vessel, it is reasonable to believe that such vessel is being used or may be used to 10 violate any of the provisions of this chapter or any law or 11 regulation of the Trust Territory. 12 (2) 'Innocent passage' means navigation through 13 territorial waters for the purpose either of traveling it 14 bona fide en route from one point to another on the usual 15 course for such travel, wind and weather permitting, 16 without entering inland waters, or of proceeding to inland 17 waters at a point of entry, or of making for the high sea 18 from inland waters, and includes stopping or anchoring only 19 if incidental to ordinary navigation or in an emergency. 20 (3) 'Territorial waters' means the waters of the 21 Territorial Sea as defined and described in section 202 102 22 of this title. 23 24 (4) 'Unlicensed vessel' means any vessel not operating under license, grant, or express permission of the High 25

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1	Commissioner of the Trust Territory, except public vessels
2	of the United States traveling under proper orders and not
3	engaged in commercial activities, outrigger vessels of all
4	kinds, and vessels propelled by outboard motors."
5	Section 9. Section 210 of title 32 of the Code of the Federated
6	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
7	"Section 210. Application - Business with interstate or
8	international character. If the Board determines that the
9	applicant's business falls within one or more of the
10	categories set out in section 209 of this chapter, the
11	procedures set forth in sections 40% 211 through 412 215 of
12	this chapter shall apply."
13	Section 10. Section 166 of title 52 of the Code of the
14	Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
15	"Section 166. Performance increase. When an employee's
16	performance, as determined through an objective evaluation,
17	has met accepted standards of productivity during a
18	specified period, his base salary may be increased by one
19	step in the appropriate level of the base salary schedule.
20	For an increase to step 2, 3, or 4, the required period
21	shall be fifty-two calendar weeks; for an increase to 5, 6,
22	or 7, the required period shall be one hundred four
23	calendar weeks. No employees shall have a base salary
24	above the maximum step prescribed for his pay level unless
25	he was receiving such compensation on the effective date of

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1	this section."
2	Section 11. Section 124 of title 54 of the Code of the
3	Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
4	"Section 124. Source of wages; ** Appoint Apportionment.
5	(1) If an employee is credited or paid salaries or
6	wages derived from, or attributable to, personal services
7	performed or rendered both within and without the Federated
8	States of Micronesia during any given month, then the whole
9	of the salaries or wages shall be presumed to have been
10	earned within the Federated States of Micronesia.
11	(2) The employer paying the tax or the employee whose
12	compensation is taxed may file for an apportionment of the
13	tax on a form prescribed by the Secretary and the tax shall
14	be levied only on that portion of the salary or wages which
15	is attributable to personal services performed or rendered
16	within the Federated States of Micronesia."
17	Section 12. Section 803 of title 54 of the Code of the
18	Federated States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
19	"Section 803. Rules and regulations - Promulgation by
20	Secretary of Finance.
21	(1) The Secretary of Finance, with the approval of
22	the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, shall
23	prescribe such rules and regulations as are necessary to
24	collect all taxes, fees, and charges levied or imposed
25	under this title and all such taxes, fees, and charges

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1		shall be deposited in the General Fund of the Federated
2		States of Micronesia for appropriation by the Congress of
3		the Federated States of Micronesia.
4		(2) Such rules and regulations shall wherever
5		practicable require payment in full of all taxes, fees, and
6		charges immediately upon assessment, and in the case of
7		import taxes, no later than fifteen days after the
8		departure of the vessel or plane on which the
9		products subject to import taxes arrived and before any
10		merchandise is released by the carrier or his agent to the
11		importer and, in the case of export taxes, before any
12		merchandise is loaded on any vessel or aircraft."
13	Secti	on 13. Section 805 of title 54 of the Code of the
14	Federated	States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows:
15		"Section 805. Distribution of revenues.
16		(1) The treasurer of the Trust Territory, or his
17		successor, shall pay eighty percent of the net taxes
18		collected pursuant to section 201(4) 201(9) of this title,
19		and fifty percent of all other net taxes collected pursuant
20		to sections 121, 141, and 201 of this title, into the
21		treasury of the State government to which the taxes are
22		attributable for appropriation by the State legislature.

(2) 'Net taxes'as used in subsection (1) of this

section means gross collections of taxes, penalties,

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1	the cost of administration.
2	(3) 'Cost of administration' as used in subsection
3	(2) of this section means the cost determined to be
4	allocatable to each State by the Congress of the Federated
5	States of Micronesia when making appropriations for the
6	operating expenses of the Revenue Division.
7	(4) The revenue office in each State may administer
8	the taxes of the State in which located, but those duties
9	shall not interfere with the administration of taxes
10	imposed by the laws of the Federated States of Micronesia.
11	All costs in excess of those funded by appropriations of
12	the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia required
13	for the administration of State taxes shall be borne
14	entirely by the State."
15	Section 14. Section 215 of title 55 of the Code of the
16	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 2-68,
17	3-23, 3-28 and 4-77, is hereby further amended to read as follows:
18	"Section 215. Allotment of funds - Allottees. Unless
19	otherwise specifically required by law, funds shall be
20	allotted as follows:
21	(1) The President of the Federated States of
22	Micronesia, or his designee(s), shall be the allottee of
23	all funds appropriated for the operations or activities of
24	the executive branch of the Federated States of Micronesia
25	Government.

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1	(2) The Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
2	States of Micronesia, or his designee(s), shall be the
3	allottee of all funds appropriated for the operations or
4	activities of the Congress.
5	(3) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
6	Federated States of Micronesia, or his designee(s), shall
7	be the allottee of all funds appropriated for the
8	operations or activities of the judicial branch of the
9	Federated States of Micronesia Government.
10	(4) The Public Auditor shall be the allottee of all
11	funds appropriated to the Public Auditor.
12	(5) The Governor of a State, or his designee(s),
13	shall be the allottee of all funds appropriated to the
14	State.
15	(6) The President of the Federated States of
16	Micronesia, or his designee(s), shall be the allottee of
17	any funds appropriated for any activity, entity, or person
18	not included within the provisions of subsections (4) (1)
19	through (\$) (5) of this section."
20	Section 15. Section 3 of Public Law No. 2-50 is hereby amended
21	to read as follows:
22	"Section 3. Definitions.
23	(1) The term'chief' means the chief of the Division
24	of Education of the Federated States of Micronesia.
25	(2) The term 'institution of higher education' means

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an educational institution which: 1 (a) Admits as regular students only persons 2 3 having a certificate of graduation from a school providing 4 secondary education; 5 (b) Is legally authorized to provide a program of education beyond secondary education; and 6 7 (c) Provides an educational program for which it awards a bachelor's degree or provides not less than a 8 9 two-year program which is acceptable for full credit toward such a degree; 10 11 (d) Is a public or other nonprofit institution; and 12 (e) Is accredited by a recognized accrediting 13 14 agency approved by the chief or is an institution whose credits are accepted on transfer by not less than three 15 institutions which are so accredited for credit on the same 16 basis as if transferred from an institution so accredited. 17 (3) The term 'full-time student' means a student who 18 19 is carrying a full-time academic work load in terms of course work or other required activities as determined by 20 the institution. 21 (4) The term 'full-time attendance' means compliance 22 by a full-time student with policies and regulations 23 regarding attendance in effect at the institution in which 24 25 he or she is enrolled.

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1	(5) The term 'professional' or 'graduate student' means,		
2	in general, a student who is enrolled in an academic		
3	program of instruction above the college level which is		
4	provided at an institution of higher education. The term		
5	includes:		
6	(a) That portion of any program involving a		
7	period of study beyond 4 academic years of study at the		
8	college level/; or		
9	(b) Any portion of a program leading to/:		
10	(i) A degree beyond the bachelor's or		
11	first professional degree; or		
12	(ii) A first professional degree when at		
13	least 3 years of study at the college level are required		
14	for entrance into a program leading to such degree.		
15	(6) The terms 'satisfactory standing' and 'good		
16	standing' mean the eligibility of a student to continue in		
17	attendance at the institution where he or she is enrolled		
18	as a student in accordance with the institution's standards		
19	and practices.		
20	(7) The term'academic year'or its equivalent means		
21	the number of credit hours which a student must acquire		
22	during any one school year in order to secure the degree or		
23	certificate toward which he or she is working in the number		
24	of semesters or terms normally taken therefor at the		
25	institution where he is pursuing a course of study.		

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1	(8) The term 'fund' means the National Student
2	Reposition Loan Revolving Fund."
3	Section 16. Section 7 of Public Law No. 2-50 is hereby amended
4	to read as follows:
5	"Section 7. Establishing the Student Loan Revolving Fund.
6	There is hereby established a Student Loan Revolving Fund
7	(hereinafter the 'fund'), separate from the General Fund or
8	other funds. All appropriations for student loans shall be
9	deposited in this account. In addition all repayments of
10	ptintiple principal and interest from loans made from this
11	fund shall be deposited back into the fund for the purposes
12	stated in section 2. Further, all loan repayments of
13	interest and ptippie principal for funds received from
14	appropriations made pursuant to:
15	(1) Public Law No. 1-22, as amended by Public Law No.
16	1-57; 44/4
17	(2) Public Law No. 1-106; April
18	(3) Public Law No. 1-125; and
19	(4) Public Law No. 2-21, as amended by Public Laws
20	Nos. $2-26/, 2-38$ , and $2-39$ ;
21	shall be deposited in the fund. Any unexpended money in
22	this account shall not revert to the General Fund or lapse
23	at the end of the fiscal year."
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1	Section 17. This act	shall become law upo	on approval by the
2	President of the Federated	States of Micronesia	a or upon its becoming
3	law without such approval.
