## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend Public Law No. 3-38, the Postal Crimes Act, and for other purposes.

	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
1	Section 1. Section 104 of chapter 1 of Public Law No. 3-38 is
2	hereby amended to read as follows:
3	"Section 104. Foreign mail as Federated States of Micro-
4	nesia mail. All foreign mail, while being transported
5	across the territory of the Federated States of Micro-
6	nesia under authority of law, is mail of the Federated
7	States of Micronesia, and any offense in respect thereto
8	shall be punishable as though it were Federated States
9	of Micronesia mail."
LO	Section 2. Public Law No. 3-38 is hereby amended by the
11	addition of a new section 105 to read as follows:
L2	"Section 105. Mail carriers. For purposes of this act,
13	any party, person, or business who carries the mail, be it
14	foreign mail or otherwise, as an agent, contractor, or
1.5	subcontractor to the National Government, shall be deemed
16	a mail carrier and an employee or agent of the National
17	Postal Service."
18	Section 3. Chapter 2 of Public Law No. 3-38 is hereby amended
19	to read as follows:
20	"CHAPTER 2
21	POSTAL CRIMES
22	"Section 201. Carriage of mail generally. Whoever, other
23	than a mail carrier, carries mail, collects, receives, or
24	carries any letter or packet, tonttaty to law shall be
25	tined not mote than \$100% of implished not mote than

30 days, of both violates this section.
"Section 202. Carriage of matter out of mail over post
routes. Whoever, having charge or control of any
conveyance which regularly performs trips for compensation
on any post route over which the mail is regularly carried,
and who carries any letters or packets, except such as
relate to some part of the cargo of such conveyance, or to
the current business of the carrier, or to some article
carried at the same time by the same conveyance, \$1411 be
fined not note than \$100 violates this section.
"Section 203. Private express for letters and packets
prohibited.
(1) Whoever establishes any private express for the
 conveyance of letters or packets for compensation, or in
any manner causes or provides for the conveyance of the
same by regular trips or at stated periods on any post

- (2) Whoever transmits by private express, or delivers to any agent thereof, or deposits at any appointed place, for the purpose of being so transmitted, any letter or

1		packet, shall be fined not note than \$100 violates this
2		section.
3		(3) This section shall not prohibit the conveyance
4		or transmission of letters or packets by private hands
5		without compensation or by special messenger employed
6		for the particular occasion only.
7		"Section 204. Transportation of persons acting as private
8		express. Whoever, having charge or control of any
9		conveyance, knowingly conveys or permits the conveyance
10		6f by any person acting or employed as a private express
11		for the conveyance of letters or packets for compensation,
12		and actually in possession of the same for the purpose
13		of conveying them contrary to law, shall be fined not mote
14		than \$200 violates this section.
15		"Section 205. Post office conducted without authority.
16		Whoever, without authority from the Postal Service, sets up
17		or establishes any office or place of business bearing the
18	1	sign, name, or title of post office, shall be fined not
19		note than \$500 violates this section.
20		"Section 206. Prompt delivery of mail. Whoever, having
21		charge or control of delivering mail to the postmaster or
22		post office, intentionally or knowingly fails to \$6 deliver
23		that hail all letters and packages within his power or
24		control, addressed to or destined for the postmaster or
25		post office within 3 hours after its arrival, if received

1		during business hours, and or if received after business
2		hours, within 2 hours after the next opening of business,
3		all lettets and packages within his powet of controll
4		addtessed to ot destined tot the postmastet ot post
5	1	officel shall be fined not note than \$200 violates this
6	1	section.
7		"Section 207. Desertion of mails. Whoever, having taken
8	i i	charge of any mail, voluntarily quits or deserts the same
9		before he has delivered it to the post office or to a
LO		Postal Service employee or official authorized to receive
L1		the same, shall be tined not mote than \$300% of implished
L2		not note than I feath of both violates this section.
L3		"Section 208. Obstruction of mails generally. Whoever
L4		knowingly and willfully obstructs or retards the passage
15		of the mail or any carrier or conveyance carrying the mail,
16		shall be timed not mote than \$2006 of implished not mote
17		than 6 months, of both violates this section.
18	1,	"Section 209. Obstruction of correspondence. Whoever
19		takes any article or mail out of any post office or any
20		authorized depository for mail matter, or from any mail
21		carrier, or which has been in any post office or authorized
22		depository or in the custody of any mail carrier, before it
23		has been delivered to the person to whom it was directed,
24		with design to obstruct the correspondence or to pry into
25		the business or secrets of another, or opens, secrets,

1		embezzles, or destroys the same, shall be fined not work
2		than \$2,000% of implished not mote than 8 featel of both
3		violates this section.
4	1.	"Section 210. Delay or destruction of mail. Whoever,
5		being a Postal Service officer, of employee, or their
6		agent, unlawfully secrets, destroys, detains, delays, or
7		opens any article of mail entrusted to him or which shall
8		come into his possession, and which was intended to be
9		conveyed by mail, shall be fined not mote than \$5006 of
10		imprisoned not more than 3 years, or both violates this section
11		"Section 211. Keys or locks stolen or reproduced.
12		(1) Whoever steals, embezzles, or obtains by false
13		pretense any key suited to any lock adopted by the Postal
14		Service and in use on any of the mails or bags thereof,
15		or any key to any authorized receptacle for the deposit
16		or delivery of mail matter; or
17		(2) Whoever knowingly and unlawfully makes, forges,
18		or counterfeits any such key or possesses any such mail
19		lock or key with the intent unlawfully or improperly to
20		use, sell, or otherwise dispose of the same, or to cause
21		the same to be unlawfully or improperly used, sold, or
22		otherwise disposed of; or
23	×	(3) Whoever, being engaged as a contractor or
24		otherwise in the manufacture of any such mail lock or
25		key, delivers any lock or part thereof, or key, used or

1	designed for use by the Postal Service, to any person not
2	duly authorized by the Postal Service to receive the same,
3	whilese the petson tecesting it is the contractor of his
4	agent tot thenishing the same of engaged in the manufacture
5	 theteof as authorized by the contract shall be fined not

8	"Section 212. Destruction of letter boxes or mail.
9	Whoever willfully or maliciously injures, tears down, or
10	destroys any letter box or other receptacle intended or
11	used for the receipt or delivery of mail, or breaks open
12	the same or willfully or maliciously injures, defaces, or
13	destroys any mail deposited therein, shall be fined not
14	white than \$1,000% of imprisoned not white than 3 feated bt
15	both violates this section.
16	"Section 213. Damage to mail bags. Whoever tears, cuts,
17	or otherwise damages any mail bag, pouch, or other things
18	used or designed for use in the conveyance of the mail,
19	with intent to 16% of steal remove any such mail or to
20	render the same insecure, contrary to law, shall be fined
21	hot mote than \$1,000% of implished not mote than 3 feates
22	of both violates this section.
23	"Section 214. Theft of property used by Postal Service.
24	Whoever steals or embezzles any property used by the Postal
25	Service or appropriates any such property to his own or



1		any other than its proper use, or conveys away such
2		property to the hindrance or detriment of the public
3		Postal Service, shall be fined not work less than
4	1.	\$14000 3,000, or imprisoned not mote less than 3 years,
5		or both; but if the value of such property does not exceed
6		\$100, he shall be fined not mote less than \$500 1,000, or
7		imprisoned not not less than 1 year, or both.
8		"Section 215. Theft of mail matter generally. Whoever
9		steals, destroys, or otherwise unlawfully takes any
10		article of mail from a post office, a Postal Service
11		officer, employee, or their agent, or any authorized mail
12		receptacle or locale, shall be timed not note than
13		\$260006 of implished not note than 3 feated of both
14		violates this section.
15		"Section 216. Receipt of stolen mail matter generally.
16		Whoever buys, receives, conceals, or unlawfully possesses
17		any article of mail which has been stolen or otherwise
18		unlawfully taken, knowing the same to have been #tolen of
19		bthétwise unlawfully taken, sháll be tined nót nóte thán
20		\$1,000, of implished not mote than 3 feats, of both
21		violates this section.
22		"Section 217. Theft of mail matter by officer or employee.
23		Whoever, being a Postal Service officer, of employee,
24		or their agent, embezzles any article of mail entrusted to
25		him on which somes into his passession intended to be

1	conveyed by mail, or steals or removes any of the contents
2	of a parcel intended to be conveyed by mail, shall be
3	tined not note than \$210001 of implished not note than 3
4	featel of both violates this section.
5	"Section 218. Misappropriation of postal funds. Whoever,
6	being a Postal Service officer, of employee, or their agent,
7	loans, uses, pledges, or converts to his own use, or to
8	the use of any third party, except as authorized by law,
9	any money or property coming under his control in the
10	execution or under control of his office, employment, or
11	service is guilty of embezzlement and shall be fined not
12	more than \$5,000, or in a sum equal to the amount or
13	value of the money or property embezzled, or imprisoned
14	not mote less than 5 years, or both; but if the amount
15	or value thereof does not exceed \$100, he shall be fined
16	not mote less than \$1,000, or imprisoned not mote less than
17	1 year, or both.
18	"Section 219. Falsification of postal returns to increase
19	compensation. Whoever, being a Postal Service officer, 6t
20	employee, or their agent, makes a false return, statement,
21	or account to any officer of the Federated States of
22	Micronesia, or makes a false entry in any record book or
23	account required by law to be kept in respect to the
24	business or operations of any post office, for the
25	purpose of fraudulently increasing his compensation or

1		the compensation of any officer, of employee, or agent
2		of the Postal Service, shall be fined hot mote than \$5004
3		of implished not note than I feath of both violates this section
4		"Section 220. Issuance of money orders without payment.
5		Whoever, being an officer, of employee, or their agent,
6		of the Postal Service, issues a money order without
7		having previously received the money therefor, shill be
8		fined not mote than \$500 violates this section. Postal
9		money orders shall not be issued in denominations exceeding
10		the sum of \$100.
11	i	"Section 221. Use of mails in commission of fraud.
12		Whoever shall intentionally or knowingly use the mails or
13	,	the mail system to facilitate commission of a theft, a
14		fraud, or any other criminal act as defined by title 11 of
15		the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, violates
16		this section.
17		"Section 221 222. Fireams as nonmailables.
18		(1) Firearms or ammunition are nonmailable and shall
19		not be deposited in or carried by the mails or delivered
20		by any officer or employee of the Postal Service; PROVIDED
21		that firearms or ammunition may be conveyed in the mails,
22		under such regulations as the Postal Service may prescribe,
23		to State or National law enforcement officers, or to such
24		others as the Postal Service, by regulation, may allow.
25		(2) For purposes of this section, 'firearm' means any

device, by whatever name known, which is designed or may
be converted to expel or hurl a projectile or projectiles
by the action of an explosion, a release, or an expansion
of gas, including, but not limited to, guns, but
excepting & devices designed or redesigned for use solely
as a signaling, line throwing, spearfishing, or industrial devic
(3) Whoever knowingly deposits for mailing or
delivery, or knowingly causes to be delivered by mail, any
firearm declared nonmailable by this section shall be
fined not white less than \$1,000, or imprisoned not white
less than 2 years, or both.
"Section 222 223. Injurious articles as nonmailable.
(1) All kinds of poison, and all articles and
compositions containing poison, and all poisonous animals,
insects, reptiles, and all explosives, inflammable
materials, and mechanical, chemical, or other devices or
compositions which may ignite or explode, and all disease

germs or scabs, and all other natural or artificial

articles, compositions, or material which may kill or

injure another, or injure the mails or other property,

including radioactive materials, are nonmailable matter

and shall not be conveyed in the mails or delivered from

any post office or station thereof, nor by any officer or

employee of the Postal Service or their agent.

(2) The Postal Service may permit the transmission

1	in the mails, under such rules and regulations as it shall
2	prescribe as to preparation and packing, of any such
3	articles which are not outwardly or of their own force
4	dangerous or injurious to life, health, or property.
5	(3) The transmission in the mails of poisonous drugs
6	and medicines may be limited by the Postal Service to
7	shipments of such articles from the manufacturer thereof
8	or dealer therein to hospitals and to licensed physicians
9	surgeons, dentists, pharmacists, and veterinarians under
10	such rules and regulations as it shall prescribe.
11	(4) All spirituous, vinous, malted, fermented, or
12	other intoxicating liquors of any kind are nonmailable and
13	shall not be deposited in or carried through the mails.
14	(5) All knives having a blade which opens
15	automatically:
16	(a) By hand pressure applied to a button or
17	other device in the handle of the knife, or
18	(b) By operation of inertia, gravity, or both,
19	are nonmailable and shall not be deposited in or carried
20	by the mails or delivered by any officer or employee of
21	the Postal Service.
22	(6) Whoever knowingly deposits for mailing or
23	delivery, or knowingly causes to be delivered by mail,
24	detectable to the altestica thetech of at any blace at

which it is directed to be deliketed by the petson to whom

1		it is additioned anything declared nonmailable by this
2		section, unless in accordance with the rules and
3		regulations anthotized to be prescribed by the Postmaster
4		General, shall be fined not white less than \$1,000, or
5		imprisoned not mote less than one 1 year, or both.
6		(7) Whoever knowingly deposits for mailing or
7		delivery, or knowingly causes to be delivered by mail,
8		detotalng to the ditection theteon, of at any place to
9		which it is ditected to be delibeted by the petson to whom
10		it is additional anything declared nonmailable by this
11		section, whether or not transmitted in accordance with
12		the rules and regulations authorized to be prescribed by
13		the Postmaster General, with intent to kill or injure
14		another, or injure the mails or other property, shall
1.5		be fined not mote less than \$10,000, or imprisoned not
16		note less than 20 years, or both.
17		(8) Whoever is convicted of any crime prohibited
18		by this section, which has resulted in the death of any
19		person, shall be subject also to imprisonment for life,
20		if the terms of title 11, section 911, of the Code of the
21	1	Federated States of Micronesia are met, and if the Court
22		shall in its discretion so direct.
23		(9) Until the regulations referred to in this
24		section and the preceding section have been promulgated by
25		the appropriate authority, it shall be a violation of this

1	act to mail any firearm, ammunition, or injurious article,
<b>2</b> .	which violation shall be punishable by a fine of not less
3 :	than \$1,000, or imprisonment for not less than 1 year, or
4	both. Upon promulgation by the proper authority of
5	appropriate regulations allowing for the exceptions as
6	outlined above, this section shall be void.

18		to avoid payment of lawful postage thereon, shall for each

21		"Section 228 229. Postage collected unlawfully. Whoever,
22		being a Postal Service officer, of employee, or their agent,
23		authorized to receive the postage of mail matter, fraud-
24		ulently demands or receives any rate of postage or gratuity
25	•	or reward other than is provided by law for the postage

1	of such mail matter, shall be fined hot white than \$1906
2	of implished hot mote than a monthal of both violates

4	"Section 230. Punishments established.
5	(1) Any person convicted of violating section 201,
6	202, 227, or 229 of this act, shall be fined not less than
7	\$100, or imprisoned not less than 30 days, or both.
8	(2) Any person convicted of violating section 204,
9	206, 208, 220, or 224 of this act, shall be fined not less
10	than \$500, or imprisoned not less than 6 months, or both.
11	(3) Any person convicted of violating section 203,
12	205, 207, 210, 211, 219, 225, or 226 of this act, shall be
13	fined not less than \$1,000, or imprisoned not less than
14	1 year, or both.
15	(4) Any person convicted of violating section 209,
16	212, 213, 215, 216, 217, or 222 of this act, shall be fined
17	not less than \$2,000, or imprisoned not less than 2 years,
18	or both."
19	Section 4. This act shall become law upon approval by the
20	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
21	becoming law without such approval.
