### PRESIDENTIAL COMM. No. 7-263 FSM CONGRESS

#### AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 7-19, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 7-36, 7-61 and 7-64, by further amending sections 1 and 2, as amended by Public Law No. 7-64, and by amending sections 5, 12, 16 and 18 to appropriate the sum of \$374,049 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1992, as supplemental funding for the operations of the executive branch, the legislative branch, agencies, special programs, subsidies, and contributions of the National Government, to raise the employment ceiling of the National Government, to modify the lapse date of certain funds; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 7-19, as amended by Public Law No. 7-64, is hereby further amended to read as follows: "Section 1.
