## AN ACT

STATE TO THE TOTAL THE STATE OF

To appropriate the sum of \$24,796,369 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1994, for the operations of the executive branch, legislative branch, judicial branch, Public Auditor, agencies of the National Government, and for special programs, grants, subsidies, contributions, and refunds of the National Government during fiscal year 1994; to establish a budget for Compact sections 214(b), 215(a)(2), 216(a)(2), 216(a)(3), and 221(b) and to appropriate special funds available therefore under the Compact; to establish a development budget and to appropriate funds available therefore under the Compact; to establish employment ceilings; to establish overtime ceilings; and for other purposes.
