PUBLIC LAW NO. 10-4

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 9-096, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 9-105, 9-122 and 9-142, by further amending sections 1, 2, 11, and 16, as amended by Public Law No. 9-142, and by amending sections 4, 8, 12, and 14 to appropriate the sum of \$864,401 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, as supplemental funding for the operations of the executive branch, the legislative branch, the Public Auditor, and Compact Section 221(b) programs and for repayment of certain outstanding medical and educational obligations; to reprogram to other uses certain funds appropriated for personnel expenses under sections 1 and 2 of Public Law No. 9-096, as amended by Public Law No. 9-142; to change allottees and lapse date and increase the personnel ceiling of the Attorney General's Office; to repeal Public Law No. 9-049, which appropriated \$476,000 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1996, in order to make additional funds available to fund this appropriation; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 9-096, as amended by Public Law No. 9-142, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. Operating expenses of the executive branch. The sum of \$13,860,813, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1997, for the operations of the executive branch of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia during fiscal year 1997. Of the total funds appropriated under this section, \$519,000 shall be deemed to come from the funds available under section 216(a)(1) of the Compact of Free Association, and \$70,000 shall be deemed to come from the funds available under section 214(b) of the Compact of Free Association. The sum appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

(2) The number of positions authorized applies individually

to each of the departments and offices of the executive and legislative branches, the National judiciary, the Public Auditor, and to the agencies as provided in subsection (1) of this section, except that the President may transfer up to 12 positions between the departments and offices of the executive branch. This authorization of positions covers all permanent employees and all contract personnel whose employment extends for more than 90 days. No funds may be expended for unbudgeted positions."

Section 8. Section 16 of Public Law No. 9-096, as amended by Public Law No. 9-142, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 16. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979; PROVIDED, however, that the funds appropriated to Chuuk State under subsection (3) of section 10 of this act shall be

retained in the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia until a scholarship recipient is identified to the President or the President's designee, at which time scholarship funds in the amount of the scholarship award shall be disbursed directly to the educational institution in the form of a two-party check payable to both the scholarship recipient and the educational institution he or she is attending; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(o), (2)(ee)(i), (2)(ee)(ii), and (2)(ee)(iv) of section 11 of this act shall be the Governors of the respective States, and no funds appropriated under subsection (2)(o) of section 11 of this act shall be disbursed from the General Fund to the allottees unless the President certifies that the State involved has entered into a joint law enforcement agreement for the period of October 1, 1996, to September 30, 1997, with the National Government pursuant to chapter 12 of title 12 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(s) of section 11 of this act shall be the Chief Justices of the respective States; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(gg) of section 11 shall be the President of the College of Micronesia, FSM; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsections (2)(c) and (3)(d) of section 7 of this act shall be the Governor of the State of Yap, and that the allottee of all other funds appropriated

under section 7 of this act shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia, or his designee; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection (1) of section 13 shall be the Director of the Office of Administrative Services. Each allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. The authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 1997; PROVIDED, however, that the authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by sections 1(2)(i)(v), 7, 9, 10, 11(2)(w), and 13 shall not lapse; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the authority of the allottee of the funds appropriated by subsection (11)(b)(iii) of section 1 and subsection (3) of section 11 shall lapse as of September 30, 1998; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the authority of the allottee to obligate such portion of funds appropriated by subsection (2)(h) of section 1 for the yen purchase that is in excess of the amount necessary to make said purchase shall expire upon completion of said purchase."

Section 9. Public Law No. 9-049 is hereby repealed in its entirety.
