THIRD REGULAR SESSION, 1998 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 10-291, C.D.1, C.D.2

PUBLIC LAW NO. 10-90

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 10-24, as amended, by further amending sections 1 and 2, as amended by Public Law No. 10-87, by amending section 5, and by further amending section 11, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 10-32, 10-56, and 10-87, to appropriate the sum of \$801,566 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998, as supplemental funding for the National Executive Branch, the Congress, and certain other National programs, subsidies, and contributions, and to reprogram and modify the use of certain funds already appropriated, by amending section 15, to prohibit reprogramming from the staff housing line, to permit unlimited reprogramming into the recruitment and repatriation line, and by further amending section 16, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 10-56 and 10-82, to extend the lapse date on funds, and to place conditions and restrictions on their use, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 10-24, as amended by Public Law No. 10-87, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 15. <u>Reprogramming</u>.

(1) The President may reprogram up to 10 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each department and office in section 1. The President or his designee may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated to any division, and may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from each line within the budget of a division, within a department or office or its functional equivalent.

(2) The Speaker or his designee may reprogram up to 10 percent to and from the funds appropriated to each of the subsections in section 2, and may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines within the subsections of section 2.

(3) The Chief Justice or his designee may reprogram up to 15 percent to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines in section 3

(4) The Public Auditor may reprogram up to 15 percent

to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines in section 4.

(5) Allottees of funds may reprogram up to 15 percent

to and from the funds appropriated in each of the lines within the subsections of section 5.

(6) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections

(1)

through (5) of this section, no funds may be reprogrammed to or from any personnel account (except as necessary in conjunction with a position transfer permitted under section 14(2) of this act), no funds may be reprogrammed from subparagraph (a)(vi) of subsection (12) of section 1 of this act, and nonpersonnel funds may be reprogrammed without limitation to, but not from, subparagraph (a)(iii) of subsection (12) of section 1 of this act."

Section 6. Section 16 of Public Law No. 10-24, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 10-56 and 10-82, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"Section 16. <u>Allotment and management of funds and</u>

<u>lapse</u>

<u>date</u>. All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, managed, administered, and accounted for in accordance with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979; PROVIDED, however, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under section 7 of this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of Transportation, Communication and Infrastructure; and PROVIDED FURTHER that the funds appropriated to Chuuk State under subsection (3) of section 10 of this act shall be retained in the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia until a scholarship recipient is identified

to the President or the President's designee, at which time scholarship funds in the amount of the scholarship award shall be disbursed directly to the educational institution in the form of a two-party check payable to both the scholarship recipient and the educational institution he or she is attending; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(m)(ii) of section 11 of this act shall be Micronesian Legal Services Corporation; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(0) of section 11 of this act shall be the Governors of the respective States, and no funds appropriated under subsection (2)(o) of section 11 of this act shall be disbursed from the General Fund to the allottees unless the President certifies that the State involved has entered into a joint law enforcement agreement for the period of October 1, 1997, to September 30, 1998, with the National Government pursuant to chapter 12 of title 12 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottees for the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(s) of section 11 of this act shall be the Chief Justices of the respective States; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(hh)(iii)a) of section 11 of this act shall be the executive director

of the Chuuk Housing Authority; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(hh)(iii)b) of this act shall be the Governor of Chuuk State; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(ii)(i), (2)(ii)(iii) and (2)(ii)(iv) of section 11 of this act shall be the President of the College of Micronesia-FSM, who shall not authorize release of funds to be used on behalf of a student until the President is satisfied that the student has exhausted all other sources of financial assistance; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under subsection (2)(ii)(ii) of section 11 of this act shall be the Secretary of the Department of Health, Education and Social Affairs; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds appropriated under section 11(2)(jj) shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or the President's designee, who shall not obligate any funds for the participation of athletes from a State until he has first consulted with the State delegation to Congress and until a roster of athletes from that State who are qualified to participate and have agreed to do so is submitted to the Office of Sports and Youth of the Department of Health, Education, and Social Affairs; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the allottee of the funds

appropriated under subsection (1) of section 13 shall be Secretary of the Department of Finance and Administration. Each allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum appropriated. The authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30, 1998; PROVIDED, however, that the authority of the allottees to obligate funds appropriated by sections 7, 9, 10, 11(2)(w), 11(2)(ff) and 13 shall not lapse; PROVIDED FURTHER, that the authority of the allottee to obligate funds appropriated by section 11(2)(s)(iii)b) and 11(6) shall lapse as of September 30, 1999; and PROVIDED FURTHER, that the authority of the allottee of funds appropriated by section 3(3) of this act shall lapse as of September 30, 2001."

Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming law without such approval.
