## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend title 9 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, by further amending section 301, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 7-122 and 8-97, by further amending section 302, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 5-70 and 8-97, by further amending sections 303, 402 and 810, as amended by Public Law No. 8-97, and by further amending section 703, as amended by Public Law No. 5-70, for the purpose of amending the law relating to the appointment and responsibilities of National Election Officials, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 301 of title 9 of the Code of the Federated
- 2 States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 7-122 and 8-97,
- 3 is hereby further amended to read as follows:
- 4 "Section 301. Appointment of National Election
- 5 <u>Officials</u>.
- (1) The President shall appoint one National Election 6 7 Director with the advice and consent of the Congress. The National Election Director shall be a citizen of the 8 Federated States of Micronesia. The National Election 9 Director shall serve until resignation, or until removed 10 from office upon a determination by the President that 11 12 such removal is deemed necessary and appointment of a successor by the President with the advice and consent of 13

the Congress shall then take place.

appoint a national election commissioner for each of the four States [with the advice and consent of the Congress]. National election commissioners shall not concurrently serve as State election commissioners; provided, however, that if any current [N]national election commissioner is [also serving] nominated to serve as a State election commissioner, he or she may continue to serve as [N]national election commissioner until such time as a new appointment by the [President]

15	is hereby fu	urther amended to read as follows:
16	<u> 11</u>	Section 302. Powers and duties of the National Election
17	D	Director. The National Election Director shall have the
18	r	responsibility for the overall supervision and
19	a	administration of all National elections, and shall
20	q	perform such duties as are prescribed by law, which
21	i	nclude, but are not limited to the following:
22		(1) to supervise and direct the four national election
23	C	commissioners in their administration of all national and
24	S	special elections and <u>in the</u> performance[s] of <u>their</u>
25	[-	all] duties pursuant to section 303 of chapter 3 of this

2	(2) to approve the appointment by the four national
3	election commissioners of all election board members and
4	other election personnel or short term staff pursuant to
5	section 303 of chapter 3 of this title;
6	(3) to request such reports from the election board or
7	the four national election commissioners as may be
8	required by law or regulation or as the National Election
9	Director may deem necessary;
10	(4) to review all nomination petitions received by the
11	four national election commissioners pursuant to section
12	303 of chapter 3 of this title;
13	(5) to maintain a national election register;
14	(6) to review and investigate all voting and
15	registration irregularities, and any other alleged
16	violations of this title;
17	(7) to implement rules and regulations for [absentee
18	ballots for conduct of] the conduct of regular and
19	absentee balloting in all national elections;
20	(8) to issue [in accordance with chapter 1 of title 17
21	of this code] regulations not inconsistent with law to
22	implement this title, in accordance with chapter 1 of
23	title 17 of the Code of the Federated States of
24	Micronesia;
25	(9) to certify <u>and declare</u> the results of all national

1	elections;
2	(10) to rule on petitions for recount and petitions
3	alleging other election irregularities pursuant to
4	chapter 9 of this title; [and]
5	(11) to determine and prescribe forms [of] for all
6	ballots, [and the forms of all] blanks, cards of
7	instruction, pollbooks, tally sheets, and [all forms and
8	blanks] other materials required by the provisions of
9	this title for use by candidates, boards, committees, and
10	voters, and to supply the same to the national election
11	commissioners and boards of elections[-];
12	(12) to list all candidates for election on the ballot
13	for each election district in alphabetical order by first
14	name;
15	(13) to establish absentee polling places within the
16	Federated States of Micronesia, as may be required or as
17	the National Election Director may deem suitable and
18	convenient to the public; and
19	(14) to be the allottee of election funds unless
20	otherwise provided for in the act appropriating such
21	funds."
22	Section 3. Section 303 of title 9 of the Code of the Federate
23	States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 8-97, is hereby
24	further amended to read as follows:
25	"Section 303. Powers and duties of national election

1	<u>commissioner</u> . [A] <u>Each</u> national election commissioner
2	shall have responsibility for the overall supervision and
3	administration of the election within his State and shall
4	perform such duties as are prescribed by law, which
5	include, but are not limited to the following:
6	(1) to appoint all members of the several boards of
7	election in his or her State as provided for in this
8	title;
9	(2) to require such reports from the several boards as
10	may be required by law or regulation or as the national
11	election commissioner may deem necessary;
12	(3) to establish voting precincts within each election
13	district and designate appropriate polling places within
14	each voting precinct, upon recommendations of the members
15	of the board of election of the particular election
16	district;
17	(4) to receive nomination petitions;
18	[(5) to list all candidates for election on the ballot
19	for each election district in alphabetical order;
20	([6]5) to register or cause to be registered all the
21	voters in his State and to maintain the General State
22	Register as provided in this title;
23	$([7]\underline{6})$ to prepare from the General State Register a
24	registered voters list for each voting precinct prior to
25	any election;

1	([8]7) to promulgate in accordance with chapter 1 of title
2	17 of this code, local rules and regulations which are
3	consistent with rules and regulations promulgated by the
4	National Election Director pursuant to section 302 of
5	chapter 3 of this title; [and]
6	([9]8) to assist the National Election Director in
7	maintaining the national election register $[\div]$ :
8	(9) to report directly to the National Election
9	Director; and
10	(10) to execute his responsibilities and perform his
11	duties as lawfully directed and authorized by the
12	National Election Director in accordance with the
13	provisions of this title."
14	Section 4. Section 402 of title 9 of the Code of the Federated
15	States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No8-97, is hereby
16	further amended to read as follows:
17	"Section 402. <u>Powers and duties</u> . Each board of election
18	member shall have the following powers and duties:
19	(1) to perform all duties prescribed by law;
20	(2) to supervise and manage each polling place in the
21	capacity of a pollworker;
22	(3) to receive, preserve, and maintain ballot boxes,
23	locks, maps, cards of instructions, and other supplies
24	and equipment necessary to conduct $[the]$ elections;
25	(4) to give such instruction deemed necessary for the

1	orderly conduct of [the] elections;
2	(5) to provide for the issuance of all notices and
3	publications concerning [the] elections;
4	(6) to review and examine the sufficiency and validity
5	of nominating petitions and other documents where the
6	national election commissioner or the National Election
7	Director designates the board to act in his stead;
8	(7) to receive and transmit all ballot boxes, locked
9	and sealed, to the national election commissioner;
10	(8) to receive, investigate, and decide complaints
11	concerning election irregularities and determine the
12	residence qualifications of voters, subject to review
13	according to chapter 9 of this title;
14	(9) to recommend to the national election commissioner
15	designation of appropriate polling places within each
16	voting precinct or election district, as may be deemed
17	suitable and convenient to the public;
18	(10) to perform such other duties as are prescribed by
19	law or rules issued by the election commissioner or the
20	National Election Director; and
21	(11) to register electors."
22	Section 5. Section 703 of title 9 of the Code of the Federated
23	States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 5-70, is hereby
24	further amended to read as follows:
25	"Section 703. Request for ballot.

1	(1) Any registered voter qualified to vote in any
2	election may request and cast an absentee ballot with the
3	national election commissioner[+], provided[, that] he
4	meets the requirements as set forth in section 701 of
5	this title.
6	(2) Any registered voter qualified to vote by absentee
7	ballot may, not more than 120 days[, but] before the
8	close of the polling place on the day of the election,
9	request the national election commissioner in writing for
10	an absentee ballot to be voted at the election. The
11	request <u>must</u> be <u>personally signed</u> by the voter seeking to
12	vote by absentee ballot, and shall include information
13	stating the voter's voting precinct, election district,
14	reasons for being absent, address to which [he] the voter
15	wishes his ballot forwarded and [the establishment of]
16	establishing the voter's [his] right to a ballot. Only
17	the person seeking to vote by absentee ballot may submit
18	an absentee ballot request; absentee ballots may not be
19	obtained by individuals on behalf of others."
20	Section 6. Section 810 of title 9 of the Code of the Federated
21	States of Micronesia, as amended by Public Law No. 8-97, is hereby
22	further amended to read as follows:
23	"Section 810. <u>Certification and Declaration of election</u>
24	results. Upon completion of the counting and tabulation
25	of election results <u>as certified</u> by the national election

1	commissioners, and no later than three days after the
2	certification of election results from all four states
3	have been received by the National Election Director, the
4	National Election Director shall certify the <u>election</u>
5	results and shall declare as the winning candidates for
6	the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia from
7	each election district the candidates receiving the
8	plurality of votes cast in each election. <u>Upon</u>
9	certification and declaration of the results, the
10	National Election Director shall immediately provide to
11	all election candidates notice of such certification in
12	the most practical and expeditious manner available."
13	Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
14	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its becoming
15	law without such approval.
