A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 12-12, as amended, by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 7, 8, 13 and 16 to appropriate \$1,924,831 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2002 to provide \$1,300,000 for scholarships from the funds available under section 216(a)(3) of the Compact of Free Association and \$624,831 from local revenues as supplemental funding for the professional premium for the Judicial Branch, public education and the referendum on the proposed constitutional amendments, and for the Maritime Fisheries Institute; to re-designate the funding source for communications expenses; to change certain allottees and lapse dates; and for other purposes.
