PUBLIC LAW 12-11

## AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 11-53, as amended by Public Law No. 11-66, by amending section 5 to clarify the duties and activities of the Pre-Convention Committee; by amending section 6 to change the definition of quorum; by further amending section 8, as amended by Public Law No. 11-66, to allow the Convention to decide the date for a special referendum; by amending section 9 to change the provision for the expenses of delegates and staff; and by adding a new section 10 to establish a Post-Convention Committee and define its duties; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 5 of Public Law No. 11-53 is hereby
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "Section 5. Pre-Convention Committee.
- 4 (1) There shall be a Pre-Convention Committee which
- 5 shall consist of two members from each state's
- 6 convention delegation who are selected by a majority
- 7 vote of that state's convention delegation. Such
- 8 selection shall be made no later than May 19, 2001, in
- 9 writing by the state's delegation to the President of
- 10 the Federated States of Micronesia.
- 11 (2) The Pre-Convention Committee shall be convened at
- the call of the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
- 13 States of Micronesia, and shall choose its own officers
- and organize according to its own rules and procedures.
- 15 (3) The duties of the Pre-Convention Committee shall
- 16 be as follows:

1	(a) to make arrangements for accommodations,
2	equipment and facilities; PROVIDED, however, that the
3	Pre-Convention Committee shall, whenever possible,
4	arrange to utilize National Government equipment and
5	facilities;
6	(b) to make arrangements for staff;
7	(c) to prepare a budget for the Constitutional
8	Convention to be submitted to Congress in the regular or
9	special session of Congress next following;
10	(d) to confer with the various state Convention
11	delegations to identify those issues that each
12	delegation wishes to raise at the Convention;
13	(e) to commission any research that it feels
14	should be performed on issues identified by the state
15	delegations prior to the convening of the Convention;
16	(f) to specify a date for convening the
17	Convention;
18	(g) to prepare proposed rules and procedures; and
19	(h) to perform other functions not otherwise
20	reserved to the Convention which will assure a
21	successful and orderly Convention.
22	(4) Members of the Pre-Convention Committee shall be
23	entitled to per diem and travel expenses at standard
24	rates, as provided by the Financial Management
25	Regulations of the National Government of the Federated

1	States of Micronesia, while on the business of the
2	Committee.
3	(5) Staff assistance for the Pre-Convention Committee
4	shall be provided as needed through the National
5	Government of the Federated States of Micronesia.
6	(6) The Pre-Convention Committee shall complete its
7	work in no more than fifteen calendar days, except that
8	the officers of the Pre-Convention Committee shall be
9	authorized to take action thereafter, as necessary, to
10	complete preparations for the convening of the actual
11	Convention itself."
12	Section 2. Section 6 of Public Law No. 11-53 is hereby
13	amended to read as follows:
14	"Section 6. <u>Procedures</u> .
15	(1) Once convened, the Constitutional Convention shall
16	continue in session for no longer than thirty calendar
17	days, PROVIDED, however, that the Convention may:
18	(a) call recesses, PROVIDED, however, that all
19	recess days shall count as calendar days; and
20	(b) extend the session, if necessary, for up to
21	not more than fifteen additional calendar days, for a
22	total of forty-five calendar days.
23	(2) The President of the Federated States of
24	Micronesia, or his designee, shall act as President of
25	the Convention until the Convention selects a President

1	from among its membership.
2	(3) The Convention shall select, from among its
3	membership, a President and such additional officers as
4	it may deem necessary and appropriate.
5	(4) The Convention shall adopt its own rules and
6	procedures not inconsistent with this act. All sessions
7	of the Convention shall be open to the public.
8	(5) Unless otherwise provided by Convention rule, a
9	quorum of the Convention shall consist of a majority of
10	all the delegates to the Convention, PROVIDED all four
11	state delegations are present. For the purpose of
12	determining a quorum, a state delegation is present when
13	at least one-half of the delegates from that state are
14	present."
15	Section 3. Section 8 of Public Law No. 11-53, as amended by
16	Public Law No. 11-66, is hereby further amended to read as
17	follows:
18	"Section 8. <u>Duties of the Convention</u> .
19	(1) The Convention shall propose amendments to the
20	Constitution. Unless the Convention, by resolution,
21	selects an earlier date, proposed amendments will be
22	placed on a ballot for a referendum to be held in March
23	2003 or, in the event that an amendment would affect the
24	general election, in a special referendum called by the

President of the Federated States of Micronesia for

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1	December of 2002.
2	(2) Proposed amendments to the Constitution shall be
3	in the format set forth in the Constitutional Amendment
4	Procedure Act title 1, section 703 of the Code of the
5	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended, and any
6	regulations issued pursuant thereto.
7	(3) When said amendments have been proposed by the
8	Convention, the Convention shall notify the President of
9	the Federated States of Micronesia, who shall transmit a
10	copy of the amendments to the Congress of the Federated
11	States of Micronesia, and shall call a referendum as
12	provided by title 1, chapter 7 of the Code of the
13	Federated States of Micronesia, as amended."
14	Section 4. Section 9 of Public Law No. 11-53 is hereby
15	amended to read as follows:
16	"Section 9. <u>Expenses of delegates and staff</u> .
17	(1) While on the business of the Convention, all
18	delegates and staff of the Convention, including non-
19	government employees, shall be entitled to per diem and
20	travel expenses at the standard rates provided by the
21	Financial Management Regulations of the National
22	Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, if
23	eligible therefore pursuant to the guidelines set forth
24	in such regulations; PROVIDED, however, that all
25	delegates shall be eligible to receive the standard car

1	rental allowance, upon request, if supported by proper
2	documentation.
3	(2) Any delegate who is an official or employee of the
4	National Government of the Federated States of
5	Micronesia shall be placed on administrative leave with
6	pay and shall be entitled to receive his or her regular
7	salary during their service as delegate.
8	(3) Delegates not receiving administrative leave with
9	pay from their usual employment, if any, shall be
10	entitled to a stipend while on the business of the
11	Convention. The daily stipend shall be the greater of
12	three-fourths $(3/4)$ of the Delegate's daily salary or
13	\$50.00 per day.
14	(4) Upon the request of the Pre-Convention Committee,
15	staff assistance for the Constitutional Convention shall
16	be provided as needed through the National Government of
17	the Federated States of Micronesia."
18	Section 5. Public Law No. 11-53, as amended by Public Law
19	No. 11-66, is hereby further amended by enacting a new section 10
20	to read as follows:
21	"Section 10. <u>Post-Convention Duties</u> .
22	(1) All Post-Convention duties shall be completed
23	under the supervision and direction of the Convention
24	President.
25	(2) To the greatest extent possible, assistance in

1	completing Post-Convention duties shall be provided
2	through the Executive Branch of the National Government
3	of the Federated States of Micronesia.
4	(3) To the extent otherwise necessary, and at the
5	direction of the Convention President, Post-
6	Convention duties shall be completed by Convention
7	Staff.
8	(4) Post-Convention duties include the following:
9	(a) to insure the timely and accurate
LO	publication of a bound journal of the convention
L1	and its proceedings;
L2	(b) to insure timely submission and payment
L3	of all Convention expenses;
L4	(c) to develop factual written materials
L5	that set forth the content and purpose of each
L6	proposed amendment and shall be used for public
L7	education on each amendment proposed by the
L8	Convention; and
L9	(d) to perform such other duties as may be
20	assigned by the Convention."
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## PUBLIC LAW 12-11

2	the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon
