A RESOLUTION

A resolution to amend the Official Rules of Procedure of the Fifteenth Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia.		
1	WHEREAS the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia is	
2	governed by its Official Rules of Procedure; and	
3	WHEREAS Rule 15 of the Official Rules of Procedure stipulates that	
4	a motion is required to amend the said Rules; and	
5	WHEREAS a Congressional Resolution is a transparent and open	
6	mechanism for amendment of the Rules; therefore	
7	BE IT RESOLVED that the following amendments be made to the	
8	Official Rules of Procedure:	
9	(1) Amendment to the Title of the Rules	
10	Title of the Official Rules of Procedure is amended to read:	
11	"Official Rules of Procedure (November 2007)"	
12	(2) Amend Sections 1, 2 and 3 of Rule 7 to read:	
13	"Rule 7. Standing Committees	
14	Section 1. <u>Ways and Means</u> .	
15	(a) The Committee on Ways and Means shall consist of	
16	not more than seven members with at least one member from each of	
17	the four States. It shall be the duty of this committee to	
18	consider and report on all bills, resolutions, and other matters	
19	referred to it pertaining to the finances and financial	
20	administration of the Government of the Federated States of	
21	Micronesia or any of the four constituent States or a municipality	

1 thereof, such subjects to include but not be limited to taxes, export duties, and tariffs; non-tax revenues; budgets; 2 3 expenditures; appropriation measures; loans, borrowing, or 4 indebtedness on public credit; monetary claims, funding arrangements, or requirements; accounting and audits, past, 5 present or proposed; the issuance and regulation of currency; and 6 other related subjects, including Presidential nominations 7 8 submitted to the Speaker which require the advice and consent of 9 Congress. Bills and resolutions or other matters pertaining to 10 internal organization or management of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia shall also fall within the scope of 11 the duties of the Congress. It shall be the duty of this 12 committee to consider, investigate, and recommend to the Congress 13 any needed revisions of existing laws or new legislation relating 14 to any subject matter within its jurisdiction. 15

16 (b) This committee shall be responsible for reviewing specific subjects in the budget of the President, and all 17 supplementals thereto, which make a request for an appropriation 18 19 which relates to a subject matter within its jurisdiction. Pursuant to its review the committee shall recommend whether the 20 matters referred to it, or portions thereof, will be authorized, 21 22 and if so, in what amount. Following its review the committee shall promptly report its recommendation to the Congress. Those 23 24 subjects which fall within the jurisdiction of this committee 25 include, but are not limited to, the following:

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(i) Department of Finance and Administration;

1	(ii) Office of the President; and
2	[(iii) Office of Compact Management] <u>Office of</u>
3	Statistics, Budget, Overseas Development Assistance and Compact
4	Management; and
5	(iv) Public Auditor.
6	(c) This committee shall be responsible for reviewing
7	all reports referred to it by the Congress from other standing
8	committees as pertain to the budget of the President and all
9	supplementals thereto. Pursuant to said review this committee
10	shall determine to what extent funds are available to meet the
11	recommendations of the committee which authored the referred
12	report. After this determination has been made, this committee
13	shall promptly report its recommendation to the Congress. In no
14	instance may this committee recommend an appropriation in an
15	amount higher than that recommended by the Committee which
16	authored the referred report. However, this committee may
17	recommend an appropriation in a lower amount if funds are
18	determined to be insufficient to meet the recommendations
19	contained in the referred report.
20	Section 2. <u>Resources and Development</u> .
21	(a) The Committee on Resources and Development shall
22	consist of not more than seven members with at least one member
23	from each of the four States. It shall be the duty of this
24	committee to consider and report on all bills, resolutions, and
25	other matters referred to it pertaining to the economy of the
26	Federated States of Micronesia and the resources thereof,

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including economic planning, priorities, and policies; public or 1 private investments; development loans; foreign investment; 2 business registration and regulation; private savings and 3 4 indebtedness; bankruptcy and insolvency; secured transactions; 5 usury and banking; insurance regulation; labor and manpower development; agriculture, forestry, and internal fisheries 6 development; exploitation of land-based mineral resources; land 7 management, industries, and public utilities; interstate trade and 8 9 commerce; intellectual property rights; regulation and management of ownership, exploitation, and exploration of mineral or natural 10 resources within marine space of the Federated States of 11 Micronesia beyond 12 nautical miles from baselines; and other 12 related subjects, including Presidential nominations submitted to 13 14 the Speaker which require the advice and consent of Congress. It shall be the duty of this committee to consider, investigate, and 15 recommend to the Congress any needed revisions of existing laws or 16 new legislation relating to any subject matter within its 17 18 jurisdiction.

19 (b) This committee shall be responsible for reviewing specific subjects in the budget of the President, and all 20 21 supplementals thereto, which make a request for an appropriation which relates to a subject matter within its jurisdiction. 22 Pursuant to its review the committee shall recommend whether the 23 24 matters referred to it, or portions thereof, will be authorized, and if so, in what amount. Following its review the committee 25 26 shall promptly report its recommendation to the Congress. Those

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1	subjects which fall within the jurisdiction of this committee
2	include, but are not limited to, the following:
3	(i) Department of [Economic Affairs] <u>Resources</u>
4	and Development;
5	(ii) Pacific Asian Travel Association;
6	(iii) Micronesian Maritime Authority; [and]
7	(iv) Pacific Island Development Program; and
8	(v) Office of Environment and Emergency
9	Management.
10	Section 3. Health, Education and Social Affairs.
11	(a) The Committee on Health, Education and Social
12	Affairs shall consist of not more than seven members with at least
13	one member from each of the four States. It shall be the duty of
14	this committee to consider and report on all bills, resolutions,
15	and other matters referred to it pertaining to the preservation of
16	the physical and natural environment; physical and mental health
17	of the general public; public education; public welfare; social
18	security and general well-being of the people of the Federated
19	States of Micronesia; and other related subjects, including
20	Presidential nominations submitted to the Speaker which require
21	the advice and consent of Congress. It shall be the duty of this
22	committee to consider, investigate, and recommend to the Congress
23	any needed revisions of existing laws or new legislation relating
24	to any subject matter within its jurisdiction.
25	(b) This committee shall be responsible for reviewing

26 specific subjects in the budget of the President, and all

supplementals thereto, which make a request for an appropriation 1 2 which relates to a subject matter within its jurisdiction. 3 Pursuant to its review the committee shall recommend whether the 4 matters referred to it, or portions thereof, will be authorized, 5 and if so, in what amount. Following its review the committee 6 shall promptly report its recommendation to the Congress. Those subjects which fall within the jurisdiction of this committee 7 include, but are not limited to, the following: 8 9 (i) Department of Health [Education] and Social 10 Affairs; 11 (ii) Department of Education 12 (iii) Board of Regents of the College of 13 Micronesia; 14 (iv) College of Micronesia operations; 15 (v) Compact Section 221(b) programs; (vi) Vocational agricultural programs; [and] 16 17 (vii) East-West Center; and (viii) Office of National Archives, Culture and 18 19 Historic Preservation. 20 (3) Amend Section 6, Rule 9 to read: "Rule 9. Motions 21 22 Section 6. Motion to reconsider. 23 When a main motion has been made once and carried in the 24 affirmative or negative, it shall be in order for any Member of 25 the Congress to move to reconsider it on [the same or] a 26 succeeding day of the sessions. <u>No motion to reconsider may be</u>

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made on same day as the main motion. If the main motion occurs on 1 the last day of a session, a motion to reconsider may not be made. 2 Such motion shall take precedence over all other motions except a 3 4 motion to adjourn or to recess or a motion to recall. The motion shall be decided without debate and shall be put to a vote as soon 5 The motion to reconsider shall be deemed to have passes 6 as made. 7 if the number of affirmative votes equals or exceeds the number required for passage of the main motion being reconsidered.
