A RESOLUTION

Calling upon the Department of Health and Social Affairs to dramatically improve the delivery of health services to citizens of the FSM, particularly with regard to the preventable and/or treatable communicable diseases such as tuberculosis, hepatitis B and syphilis, in order to be responsive to the concerns of the State of Hawaii and other affected jurisdictions concerning the health status of migrants from the FSM to those jurisdictions.

WHEREAS, the State of Hawaii, Guam, The Commonwealth of the 1 2 Northern Mariana Islands and American Samoa are recognized as 3 "affected jurisdictions" by the amended Compact of Free Association between the Federated States of Micronesia and the 4 Untied States of America; and 5 6 WHEREAS, provisions were made by the Congress of the United 7 States pursuant to U.S. Public Law 108-188 for annual appropriations through fiscal year 2023 for grants to affected 8 9 jurisdictions as a result of increased demands placed on health, 10 educational, social, or public safety services or infrastructure due to residence in affected jurisdictions of qualified 11

12 nonimmigrants from the FSM, Republic of Marshall Islands or the 13 Republic of Palau; and

WHEREAS, the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii passed resolution HR No. 94 HD 16 1 on 12 April 2007 calling for the Department of the Attorney 17 General to convene a task force to investigate and coordinate the 18 provision of medical and social services to migrants from Freely 19 Associated States; and

1 WHEREAS, the Senate of Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii passed resolution SR No. 142 SD1 on 13 April 2007 2 calling for the Department of the Attorney General to convene a 3 task force to investigate and coordinate the provision of medical 4 and social services to migrants from Freely Associated States; AND 5 6 WHEREAS the aforesaid resolutions recite that there are high rates of tuberculosis, hepatitis B and syphilis reported among 7 migrants from Freely Associated States; and 8

9 WHEREAS, it is not the intent of the Federated States of 10 Micronesia that the Compact cause unanticipated adverse 11 consequences or an exceptional burden on the social and health 12 care systems of an affected jurisdiction; and

13 WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the Federated States of 14 Micronesia to be responsive to the concerns of the State of Hawaii 15 and other affected jurisdictions concerning the health status of 16 its migrants to those jurisdictions, and to combat any negative 17 attitudes or discrimination towards them while living and working 18 abroad; and

WHEREAS, an initial step toward improved delivery of health care services within the Federated States of Micronesia was the establishment of a separated Department of Health and Social Affairs by FSM Public Law 15-09; and

23 WHEREAS, it is in the interest of the Federated States of 24 Micronesia to determine the incidence of preventable and/or 25 treatable communicable diseases such as tuberculosis, hepatitis B 26 and syphilis within its population, and take all reasonable steps

1 to eradicate such diseases from its citizens both at home and 2 abroad; now therefore

3 BE IT RESOLVED that the Fifteenth Congress of the FSM calls 4 upon the Department of Health and Social Affairs to dramatically 5 improve the delivery of health services to citizens of the FSM, 6 particularly with regard to the preventable and/or treatable 7 communicable diseases such as tuberculosis, hepatitis B and 8 syphilis.

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 resolution be provided to the President of the Federated States of 11 Micronesia, the Secretary of the Department of Health and Social 12 Affairs, the House of Representatives of the Twenty-fourth 13 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, and the Senate of the Twenty-14 fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii.
