## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To appropriate from the general fund of the Federated States of Micronesia a supplemental funding in the total amount of \$4,812,860, of which amount, \$1,174,340 is from the Fiscal Year 2011 Compact grants from Infrastructure and Capacity Building Sectors, and \$3,638,520 is from domestic revenue in the general fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for fiscal year ending September 30, 2011, by amending sections 1, 2, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 16-43, as amended by Public Law No. 16-48, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 16-43, as amended by
Public Law No. 16-48, is hereby further amended to read as
