## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend section 2 of Public Law No. 16-23, as amended by Public Law No. 16-29, for the purpose of changing the allottee of certain funds previously appropriated therein for public projects and social programs in the State of Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 16-23, as amended

by Public Law No. 16-29, is hereby further amended to read as

3 follows:

"Section 2. Allotment and management of funds and lapse date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be 5 6 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in accordance with applicable laws, including, but not 7 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The 8 9 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used 10 11 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum 12 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated 13 under Section 1 of this act shall be the President of 14 the Federated States of Micronesia; PROVIDED HOWEVER 15 16 that the allottee of funds appropriated in Section 1(3)(a),  $[\frac{b}{a}]$ , (d), (e) and (f) of this act shall be 17 the Chuuk State Commission on Improvement Project 18 19 (CSCIP). The allottee of funds appropriated under
