A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 of Public Law No. 17-68 for the purpose of changing the use and allottee of certain funds previously appropriated to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA: 1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 17-68 is hereby amended to read as follows: 2 3 "Section 2. All funds appropriated by this act shall be 1 date. allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in 2 3 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. 4 The allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these 5 6 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used 7 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that 8 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum 9 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated 10 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap The allottee of funds appropriated under 11 State. sections 3 and 4 of this act shall be the President of 12 13 the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the allottee of funds appropriated under 14 subsection 1 of section 3 of this act shall be the 15 Governor of Kosrae State, the allottee of funds 16 17 appropriated under subsection 3(2)(p) of this act shall 18 be the Mayor of Lelu Municipal Government or his designee and the allottee of funds appropriated under 19 20 subsection 1 of section 4 of this act shall be the 21 Governor of Pohnpei State. The allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(1) of this act shall be 22 23 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under 24 subsection 5(2)(a) of this act shall be the Governor of 25

1	Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee of funds
2	appropriated under subsection 5(2)(b) of section 5 of
3	this act shall be the Mortlock Islands Development
4	Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under
5	subsection 5(2)(c) of section 5 of this act shall be the
6	Executive Director of the Northern Namoneas Social and
7	Economic Development Authority or his designee. The
8	allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2)(d)
9	of section 5 of this act shall be the [Faichuk
10	Development Authority] Southern Namoneas Development
11	Authority or its designee. The allottee of funds
12	appropriated under subsection 5(2)(e) of section 5 of
13	this act shall be the [Southern Namoneas Development
14	Authority] Faichuk Development Authority or its
15	designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under
16	subsection 5(2)(f) of this act shall be the Northwest
17	Island Development Authority. The authority of the
18	allottee to obligate funds appropriated by this act
19	shall lapse on September 30, 2014.

2 becoming law without such approval.
