Health and Social Affairs, the FSM National Archives, Culture and Historic Preservation Office, the Department of Justice and the Department of Finance and Administration.

Representatives from the Department of Health and Social Affairs confirmed for the Committee that the funding was to assist in the continuation of the successful program of treating the communicable diseases of HIV, viral hepatitis, sexually transmitted diseases tuberculosis and the effects of these diseases. This funding would be for this calendar year of 2014. This program is well known to the Committee and it lauds the hard work that the Department has done in this area.
