Total	\$40,000

Members of your committee expressed their strong desire that this program include services for the children residing in our Nation's outer islands. The Department confirmed that the plans include the outer islands, and that particular attention is being paid to planning evacuation and stabilizing of children in medical emergencies who are residing in the outer islands. The Secretary confirmed that this program was being constructed to fill our Nation's very specific needs.
