our Nation's citizens. Additional financial support for this program is desirable.

The Committee was concerned with the documents presented it regarding the grant award which included approval of federal funding of \$152,924 for the year cycle, but also referenced an amount of \$38,231 as an award amount. It was explained by the Department that the \$38,231 was the quarterly allotment amount and the \$152,924 was formally transmitted as the grant award. The Justice Department representative confirmed that the \$152,924 was referenced in a proper award document and was sufficient.

The Secretary stated that the funding under this grant would pay for a specialist to travel through the four states on consultation and to provide some training. The mental health and substance abuse providers from the four state departments of health will meet within the next two months to finalize a budget for this coming year. The Department confirmed that in past years the use and division of these funds has not varied by much. Prior years budgets have been attached.

Further, the Secretary confirmed that a portion of this funding will also be used to provide youth projects in sport and cultural activities to give our young people positive uses for their time, and provide healthy interaction with good role models.
