our Nation's citizens. Continued financial support for this program is desirable.

Attached to this report is the brief one page budget summary for the coming year from Presidential Communication 18-317. The Committee noted that the budget for the National Department of Health and Social Affairs was much larger than those for any of the four states. When your Committee made inquiries regarding this issue the Secretary stated this was due to technical support and systems resting at the National level. At the time of the hearing the Department submitted a slightly revised budget that has recently been submitted and approved by the donor. This is attached for the members review.

During the hearing your Committee inquired how long the project would take to update and clean the health data, prefacing this question in the context of funding decreases and possible elimination in the future. The Department responded that once the foundational work was done the system for data gathering and tracking should take much less effort and funding to maintain.

Overall your Committee on Health and Social Affairs is supportive of the program that this grant will support. Your Committee on Health and Social Affairs is in accord with the intent and purposes of C.R. No. 18-184, and recommends its adoption in the form attached hereto.
