A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by Public Law No. 18-49, by amending section 5 thereof, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs in the State of Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 5 of Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by
Public Law No. 18-49, is hereby further amended to read as
