AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget of \$36,387,961 from the General Fund of the Federated States for fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 8, 9, 10 and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, to provide funding for operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89 is hereby

19	(xiv) Section 9(14)(g) the allottee of these
20	funds shall be the Governor of Pohnpei State.
21	(xv) Section 9(14)(h) - the allottee of these
22	funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.
23	(xvi) Section 9(14)(i) the allottee of these
24	funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.
25	(3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to

1	obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
2	of September 30, 2015; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
3	appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
4	lapse."
5	Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
6	President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
7	becoming law without such approval.
