PUBLIC LAW NO. 18-32

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 17-71, 17-81,17-84, 17-89, 17-90, 18-03, 18-10 and 18-13, by amending sections 4 and 5 therein, for the purpose of changing the use of certain funds previously appropriated to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.
