A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend section 108 of title 4 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended, to increase the salaries of the Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 108 of title 4 of the Code of the
 Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended, is
 hereby further amended to read as follows:

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"Section 108. Compensation of the Judiciary.

5 (1) Salaries. The Chief Justice of the Supreme
6 Court of the Federated States of Micronesia shall
7 receive a salary of \$[45,000] 62,000 per annum. The
8 Associate Justices of the Supreme Court shall receive
9 a salary of \$[43,000] 52,000 per annum.

10 (2) Overtime compensation. No Justices of the 11 Supreme Court shall be entitled to any form of 12 additional compensation for any work performed in 13 excess of 40 hours per week.

14 (3) Health insurance. Each Justice of the Supreme
15 Court shall be entitled to participate in the
16 National Government group health insurance program in
17 effect during his tenure in office, under the same
18 terms and conditions which apply to employees of the

1 National Public Service System. 2 (4) Housing. Furnished housing and all utilities 3 shall be provided without cost to each Justice of the 4 Supreme Court. (5) Vehicle. Each Justice of the Supreme Court 5 6 shall be provided with a Government automobile at his duty station, which shall be used primarily for 7 8 official business. 9 (6) Recruitment expenses. 10 (a) Each Justice of the Supreme Court shall be 11 entitled to whatever recruitment expenses are 12 available to regular Government prime contract 13 employees at the time he is confirmed, under the same terms and conditions which apply to employees of the 14 15 National Public Service System. 16 (b) For the purpose of determining the benefits 17 available pursuant to this subsection, the dependents, if any, of each Justice shall be 18 19 determined in accordance with subsection (9) of this 20 section. 21 (c) The shipment of household goods and 22 personal effects for each Justice must commence 23 within two years of the date of entry on duty of the 24 Justice, notwithstanding any contrary provisions of 25 the standard government prime contract.

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(d) Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of 1 2 this section, the household goods and personal effects of any Justice confirmed after the effective 3 4 date of the act from which this section derives, must be shipped to his duty station within the time limit 5 6 applicable to regular Government prime contract employees at the time he is confirmed. 7 8 (7) Repatriation expenses. 9 (a) Whenever a Justice of the Supreme Court shall retire or otherwise terminate his service as a 10 Justice of the Court, he shall be entitled to 11 12 whatever repatriation expenses are available to 13 regular Government prime contract employees at the 14 time he terminates his service, under the same terms 15 and conditions which apply to employees of the National Public Service System; provided, however, 16 17 that for the purpose of determining the benefits available pursuant to this section, the dependents, 18 19 if any, of each Justice shall be determined in 20 accordance with subsection (9) of this section.

(b) The provisions of this subsection shall not
apply to any Justice who terminates his service as a
Justice of the Supreme Court due to impeachment.
(8) Life insurance. Each Justice of the Supreme

25 Court shall be entitled to participate in the

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National Government group life insurance program in 1 2 effect during his tenure in office, under the same terms and conditions which apply to employees 1 of 3 4 the National Public Service System. (9) Dependents. As used in this section, the term 5 "dependents" is limited to the spouses and children 6 7 of Justices; provided, that no child shall be 8 considered a dependent after he graduates from undergraduate school, is married, or reaches the age 9 10 of twenty-two years, whichever occurs first. (10) Compensation limitations. No Justice of the 11 12 Supreme Court shall be entitled to any benefits, 13 remuneration, salary, or any other form of compensation except as provided by this section." 14 15 Section 2.
