Dear Speaker Simina:

I am transmitting the following Congressional Act, which I have signed to become Public Law No. 19-27:

Congressional Act No. 19-27, entitled: "AN ACT TO FURTHER AMEND PUBLIC LAW NO. 18-89, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, 19-02 AND 19-09, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 4, 8, 9 AND 13 THEREOF, TO CHANGE THE USE AND ALLOTTEE OF FUNDS PREVIOUSLY APPROPRIATED THEREIN, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

The only amendment in the act is to transfer \$50,000 from personnel funding of the FSM Supreme Court to contractual services. As for sections 2, 3 and 4 of the act, they are not necessary in the act because they introduce no changes to the public law.

#### AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, 19-02 and 19-09, by amending sections 4, 8, 9 and 13 thereof, to change the use and allotee of funds previously appropriated therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law No. 18-89, is hereby 2 amended to read as follows: 3 "Section 4. Operating Expenses of the National Judicial 4 Branch. 8	necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
9	this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
10	of the sums appropriated.
11	(2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
12	appropriated by this act are as follows:
13	(a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
14	shall be the President of the Federated States of
15	Micronesia;
16	(b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds

11	the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of
12	Micronesia; and
13	(iv) Section $9(1)(a)$ through $(c)$ - the
14	allottee of these funds shall be the President of the
15	College of Micronesia-FSM.
16	(v) Section $9(4)(g)$ -the allottee of these
17	funds shall be the Governor of Chuuk State.
18	(vi) Section 9(4)(i)-the allottee of these
19	funds shall be the Governor of Yap State.
20	(3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
21	obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as
