
I am transmitting the following Congressional Act, which I have signed to become Public Law No. 19-83 with line item veto:

Congressional Act No. 19-90: AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$2,468,650 FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2016, BY AMENDING SECTIONS 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 AND 12 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 19-32, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NO. 19-45 AND 19-61, FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

I decided to line item veto the \$500,000 appropriation for Chuuk State infrastructure priority projects (partial) FY15 because this item bears no relation to the FY16 budget. This line item should be part of a congressional public project or other appropriate legislation. Similarly, line items for infrastructure priorities allocated to the other states should likewise be in a separate bill.

In closing, I wish to thank Congress for the passage of the supplemental budget.

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AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$2,468,650 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2016, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by Public Laws No. 19-45 and 19-61, for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 19-32, as amended by  
2 Public Laws No. 19-45 and 19-61, is hereby further amended to

9 The sum of \$38,303,498, or so much thereof as  
10 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from  
11 the General Fund of the Federated States of  
12 Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September  
13 30, 2016, for the following capital  
14 improvements, development programs, and projects  
15 and human resources development. Of the total  
16 amount of funds appropriated herein, \$689,598  
17 shall be deemed to come from funds available  
18 under the Amended Compact from the Supplemental  
19 Education Grant. The sum appropriated by this  
20 section shall be apportioned as follows:

19 Section 6. Section 12 of Public Law No. 19-32, as  
20 amended by Public Law No. 19-45, is hereby further amended  
21 to read as follows:

22 "Section 12. Allotment and management of funds  
23 and lapse dates.

24 (1) General provisions.

25 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be

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1           allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
2           accordance with applicable law, including, but not  
3           limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

4                   (b) The allottees shall be responsible for  
5           ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be  
6           necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in  
7           this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess  
8           of the sums appropriated.

9                   (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds  
10          appropriated by this act are as follows:

11                   (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds  
12          shall be the President of the Federated States of  
13          Micronesia;

14                   (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds  
15          shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated  
16          States of Micronesia;

17                   (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds  
18          shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the  
19          Federated States of Micronesia;

20                   (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds  
21          shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of  
22          Micronesia;

23                   (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of  
24          these funds shall be the President of the Federated  
25          States of Micronesia; PROVIDED HOWEVER, that for the

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1 following subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this  
2 act:

3 (i) Section 8(6)(g) - the allottee shall be  
4 the President of the College of Micronesia - FSM;

5 (ii) Section 8(6)(h) through (i) - the  
6 allottee of these funds shall be the Governor of the  
7 State of Chuuk;

8 (iii) Section 8(8)(e) - the allottee of these  
9 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

10 (iv) All subsections under Section 8(9) -  
11 the allottee of these funds shall be the Speaker of the  
12 Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia;

13 (v) Section 8(12)(a) through (d) - the  
14 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of  
15 the respective State Supreme Court;

16 (vi) Section 8(12)(n) - the allottee of these  
17 funds shall be the Speaker of Congress of the Federated  
18 States of Micronesia;

19 (vii) Section 9(1)(a) through (c) - the  
20 allottee of these funds shall be the President of the  
21 College of Micronesia-FSM;

22 (viii) Section 9(12)(a)(i)(ii) and (iii) - the  
23 allottee of these funds shall be Governor of Chuuk  
24 State;

25 (ix) Section 9(12)(b)-(d) - the allottee of

1           these funds shall be the Governor of the respective  
2           states.

3                       (x) Section 9(12)(f) – the allottee of  
4           these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Kosrae  
5           State Supreme Court;

6                       (xi) Section 9(12)(g) – the allottee of  
7           these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Chuuk  
8           State Supreme Court;

9                       (xii) Section 9(12)(h) – the allottee of  
10          these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Yap  
11          Supreme Court;

12                      (xiii) Section 9(12)(i) – the allottee of  
13          these funds shall be the Chairman of the Chuuk  
14          Delegation to the FSM Congress."

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1       Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
3 becoming law without such approval.

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
