

#### PUBLIC LAW No 1 9- 09

#### AN ACT

To appropriate a supplemental budget in the amount of \$593,396 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2015, by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9, and 13 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02 to change the conditions of certain funds therein, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 18-89, as amended

2 by Public Laws Nos. 18-102, 18-110, 18-116, and 19-02, is hereby

The purpose of this act is to 5 appropriate the sum of \$99,046,644 from the General Fund 6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal 7 year ending September 30, 2015, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the National 8 9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and 10 11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources 12 The National Government's share of the Development. 13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero except 14 that the National Government will retain ten percent 15 (10%) of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is 16 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education. The budget shall also include appropriations for COM-FSM 17
