EIGHTH SPECIAL SESSION, 2019 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 20-317, C.D.1, C.D.2

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159 and 20-172, in order to appropriate \$5,707,906 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, various grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by 1
- 2 Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159 and 20-172, is hereby further
