#### TWENTIETH CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

SEVENTH SPECIAL SESSION, 2019 CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 20-292, C.D.1, C.D.2, C.D.3, C.D.4

#### AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Laws No. 20-154 and 20-159, in order to appropriate \$15,963,478 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, various grants, subsidies and contributions, and capital and human resources development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by
- 2 Public Laws No. 20-154 and 20-159, is hereby further amended to
