Your Committee held a public hearing on the above captioned matter on September 24, 2018. Present at this hearing were the Secretary of the Department of Education and his key staff, and representatives from the Department of Justice, the Department of Finance and Administration, and the Office of the President.

Staff from the NDOE Division of Special Education, including its Acting Chief of the Division were present at the hearing and gave an update of the services and programs for this school year 2018/2019. The grant which is the subject of this report is the first half of the funding for this school year.

The Division of Special Education has always been an important part of our Nation's educational system. The program is well known to the Committee. The Division of Special Education provided new statistics to the Committee that show for school year 2018/2019 it will serve the needs of 1,851 of our young people from age 3 to 21 who have disabilities. Currently the number of personnel, including all teachers and administrators at the state level, is 308. Over the last several years the number of students has declined slightly reflecting the general trend in out migration.

The Committee inquired as to the breakdown for funding for this grant. The Division of Special Education stated that each of the four states and the National Government will receive \$184,517 to begin the new school year with. Currently 80% of the proposed funding is to be used for personnel throughout the four states and at the National Government. There will be a second phase of this grant towards the end of the year with approximately \$3 million that will be based on the following formula for distribution based on three factors: 1) population of the state, 2) number of children per state served, and 3) performance. Performance reports and activities for the Division of Special Education are on its website, which is also a link in the main NDOE website.

At the close of the hearing the Committee requested that NDOE Division of Special Education work with the Executive branch if additional funding from domestic revenue is still requested for the coming fiscal year. The Committee adhered to the call to maintain budgets and employee caps
