The newborn hearing-screening project is well known to the Committee and has been very successful for the last several years. The program has screening rates for newborn hearing at approximately 80%. The testing rates are down from previous years due largely to women leaving the hospital immediately after birth, and therefore, not making the newborn available for screening. The Committee appreciates the hard work done by this project. It further appreciates that it utilizes the permanent staff of the state hospitals to do the necessary training and does not hire additional employees.

The budget proposed for the coming year is attached for member's review. Your Committee notes that the budget and activities remain substantially the same as in years past.

Your Committee is strongly supportive of the Department of Health and Social Affairs' efforts to ensure all our Nation's newborn infants are screened for hearing, and it is therefore, for the reasons set forth above, your Committee on Health and Social Affairs supports the grant activities proposed to be funded, it is in accord with the intent and purpose of C.R. No.20-134 and recommends its adoption in the form attached hereto.
