## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, and 8 of Public Law No. 21-185, to appropriate \$513,753 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, in order to provide supplemental funding for the Office of Personnel, to provide funding for the Constitutional Public Education Campaign, to authorize payment of arrears in housing allowance; and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-285 is hereby

The purpose of this act is to appropriate the sum of \$[63,760,467] 64,274,220 from the 4 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for 5 6 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, for the purpose of funding the operations of all branches of the 7 National Government of the Federated States of 8 9 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, 10 subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human 11 Resources Development. The National Government's share 12 of the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; 13 EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent 14 15 of the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is 16 reflected in the budget for the Department of Education. 17 The sum appropriated herein shall be apportioned as
