A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 1, 2, 6, 7, 8, and 9 of Public Law No. 21-185, as amended by Public Law No. 21-210, to appropriate a total of \$5,948,555 of supplemental funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, for its various Departments, Agencies and Special Programs, to provide additional supplemental funding for Subsidies and Contributions and for Capital Projects, and for other purposes.
