### PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-167

A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 15-32, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78, 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-17, 18-67, 18-85, 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-34, 20-38 and 21-144, by amending section 1 thereof, for the purpose of changing the use of certain funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Chuuk State, to offer a technical amendment, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 15-32, as amended
 by Public Laws Nos. 15-36, 15-44, 15-57, 15-63, 15-72, 15-78,
 16-03, 16-11, 16-33, 16-46, 17-12, 17-21, 17-33, 17-40, 18-67,
 18-104, 19-17, 19-100, 19-157, 20-38 and 21-144, is hereby
 further amended to read as follows:

6 "Section 1. The sum of \$3,780,000, or so much thereof, 7 is hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year 8 ending September 30, 2008, for the purpose of funding 9 public projects and social programs for the people in 10 11 each state of the Federated States of Micronesia. The 12 fund shall be apportioned on the basis of \$250,000 or 13 less per member of Congress as follows; PROVIDED THAT, 14 an increase of \$300,000 is for Yap State.
