PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-194

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 19-54, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 19-62, 19-75, 19-79, 19-99, 19-119, 20-04, 20-56, 20-82, 20-127, 21-20, 21-117, 21-169 and 21-174, by amending sections 2 and 5 thereof, to change the use of funds previously appropriated therein, to fund public projects and social programs for Yap and Chuuk States, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:
