PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-246

AN ACT

To further amend section 108 of title 4 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended of Public Law No. 19-166, to increase the salaries of the Chief Justice and Associate Justices of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

- 1 Section 1. Section 108 of title 4 of the Code of the
- 2 Federated States of Micronesia (Annotated), as amended by
- 3 Public Law No. 19-166, is hereby further amended to read as
- 4 follows:
- 5 "Section 108. Compensation of the Judiciary.
- 6 (1) Salaries. The Chief Justice of the Supreme
- 7 Court of the Federated States of Micronesia shall
- 8 receive a salary of \$80,000 per annum. The Associate
- 9 Justices of the Supreme Court shall receive a salary
- of \$70,000 per annum.
- 11 (2) Overtime compensation. No Justices of the
- 12 Supreme Court shall be entitled to any form of
- additional compensation for any work performed in
- 14 excess of 40 hours per week.
- 15 (3) Health insurance. Each Justice of the Supreme
- 16 Court shall be entitled to participate in the
- 17 National Government group health insurance program in
- 18 effect during his tenure in office, under the same

1	terms and conditions which apply to employees of the
2	National Public Service System.
3	(4) Housing. Furnished housing and all utilities
4	shall be provided without cost to each Justice of the
5	Supreme Court.
6	(5) Vehicle. Each Justice of the Supreme Court
7	shall be provided with a Government automobile at his
8	duty station, which shall be used primarily for
9	official business.
10	(6) Recruitment expenses.
11	(a) Each Justice of the Supreme Court shall be
12	entitled to whatever recruitment expenses are
13	available to regular Government prime contract
14	employees at the time he is confirmed, under the same
15	terms and conditions which apply to employees of the
16	National Public Service System.
17	(b) For the purpose of determining the benefits
18	available pursuant to this subsection, the
19	dependents, if any, of each Justice shall be
20	determined in accordance with subsection (9) of this
21	section.
22	(c) The shipment of household goods and
23	personal effects for each Justice must commence
24	within two years of the date of entry on duty of the
25	Justice, notwithstanding any contrary provisions of

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- (d) Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of this section, the household goods and personal effects of any Justice confirmed after the effective date of the act from which this section derives, must be shipped to his duty station within the time limit applicable to regular Government prime contract employees at the time he is confirmed.
 - (7) Repatriation expenses.
- (a) Whenever a Justice of the Supreme Court shall retire or otherwise terminate his service as a Justice of the Court, he shall be entitled to whatever repatriation expenses are available to regular Government prime contract employees at the time he terminates his service, under the same terms and conditions which apply to employees of the National Public Service System; provided, however, that for the purpose of determining the benefits available pursuant to this section, the dependents, if any, of each Justice shall be determined in accordance with subsection (9) of this section.
- (b) The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any Justice who terminates his service as a Justice of the Supreme Court due to impeachment.
- (8) Life insurance. Each Justice of the Supreme

1	Court shall be entitled to participate in the
2	National Government group life insurance program in
3	effect during his tenure in office, under the same
4	terms and conditions which apply to employees 1 of
5	the National Public Service System.
6	(9) Dependents. As used in this section, the term
7	"dependents" is limited to the spouses and children
8	of Justices; provided, that no child shall be
9	considered a dependent after he graduates from
10	undergraduate school, is married, or reaches the age
11	of twenty-two years, whichever occurs first.
12	(10) Compensation limitations. No Justice of the
13	Supreme Court shall be entitled to any benefits,
14	remuneration, salary, or any other form of
15	compensation except as provided by this section."
