
I am pleased to transmit the following act, which I have signed into Public Law No. 21-38:

Congressional Act No. 21-37, entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 1, 3, 8 AND 9 OF PUBLIC LAW NO. 20-131, AS AMENDED BY PUBLIC LAWS NOS. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187, 21-03 AND 21-10, IN ORDER TO APPROPRIATE \$1,660,000 OF ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE GENERAL FUND OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2019, TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDING FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE NATIONAL GOVERNMENT OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA, VARIOUS GRANTS, SUBSIDIES AND CONTRIBUTIONS AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

I express appreciation for the funding to address the dengue crisis in Yap. Although I have signed this act into law, I noted that not all the supplemental budget items from the Executive were approved. I recommend for Congress to consider other items at the next opportunity. I also noted the error in section 8, which was set out in the act even though no amendment was inserted there.

I urge Congress to rectify this in the future. Thank you.



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

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 21-64, C.D.1

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 3, 8 and 9 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187, 21-03 and 21-10, in order to appropriate \$1,660,000 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, various grants, subsidies and contributions and capital improvement projects, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by
2 Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187, 21-03 and 21-10,
3 is hereby further amended to read as follows:

4 "Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the
5 sum of \$101,451,399 from the General Fund of the
6 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year
7 ending September 30, 2019, for the purpose of funding
8 the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount form COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in
17 the budget from the Department of Education. The sum


