I take this opportunity to thank you, Speaker, and the Honorable Members of the 21st FSM Congress for the expeditious passage of the FY21 Budget. FIFTH REGULAR SESSION, 2020

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 21-302, C.D.1

AN ACT

To appropriate \$63,760,467 from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, to provide funding for the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
2 appropriate the sum of \$63,760,467 from the General Fund of the
3 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending
4 September 30, 2021, for the purpose of funding the operations of
5 all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of
6 Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
7 contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development. The
8 National Government's share of the Amended Compact funds has been
9 reduced to zero; EXCEPT THAT; the National Government will retain
10 the Compact Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
11 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the budget
12 for the Department of Education. The sum appropriated herein
13 shall be apportioned as follows:

14 Section 2. Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch. The
15 sum of \$22,664,212, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
16 hereby appropriated from the General Fund of the Federated States
17 of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2021, for
18 the purpose of funding the operations of the Executive Branch of

1 the National Government during the fiscal year 2021. The sum
2 appropriated by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

6 Section 11. Reprogramming. Reprogramming of funds into or
7 from the personnel budget line item shall not be permitted. The
8 President, Speaker, Chief Justice and Public Auditor may reprogram
9 up to 10% percent to or from the funds appropriated in sections 2
10 (Operating Expenses of the Executive Branch), 3 (Operating
11 Expenses of the Legislative Branch), 4 (Operating Expenses of the
12 National Judicial Branch), and 5 (Operating Expenses of the
13 National Public Auditor). Reprogramming of funds within a
14 department, office or agency shall be effected by the head of such
15 department, office or agency by specifying in writing to the

24 quarter all amounts reprogrammed inter or intra a department,
25 office or agency.

1 Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse
2 Dates.

3 (1) General provisions.

4 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
5 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in accordance
6 with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the
7 Financial Management Act of 1979.

8 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for ensuring
9 that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are
10 used solely for the purposes specified in this act, and that no
11 obligations are incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

12 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated
13 by this act are as follows:

15 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

3 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees
4 to obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of
5 September 30, 2021; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds appropriated
6 under section 9 of this act shall not lapse.

7 Section 13. This act shall become law upon approval by the
8 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
9 becoming law without such approval.
