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A BILL FOR AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147, to appropriate \$926,314 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, in order to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

3            Section 5. Section 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by  
4 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147 is hereby  
5 further amended to read as follows:

6                    "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and  
7 Lapse Dates.

8                    (1) General provisions.

9                    (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
10 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
11 accordance with applicable law, including, but not  
12 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

13                    (b) The allottees shall be responsible for  
14 ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be  
15 necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in  
16 this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess  
17 of the sums appropriated.

18                    (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds  
19 appropriated by this act are as follows:

20                    (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall

13 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

14 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) – the allottee of these  
15 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

16 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) – the allottee of these  
17 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

18 (v) Section 8(8)(d) – the allottee of these  
19 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

20 (vi) Section 8(11) – the allottee of these  
21 funds shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated  
22 States of Micronesia;

23 (vii) Section 8(12) – the allottee of these  
24 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the  
25 Federated States of Micronesia;

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1 (viii) Section 8(13)(a) – the allottee of these  
2 funds shall be the President of the College of  
3 Micronesia-FSM;

4 (ix) Section 8(13)(d) through (g) – the  
5 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of  
6 the respective State Supreme Court;

7 (x) Section 8(13)(h) – the allottee of these  
8 funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of  
9 the Federated States of Micronesia;

10 (xi) Section 9(1) – the allottee of these  
11 funds shall be the President of the College of  
12 Micronesia-FSM;

13 (xii) Section 9(3)(b) – the allottee of these  
14 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

15 (xiii) Section 9(3)(c) – the allottee of  
16 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of  
17 Pohnpei;

18 (xiv) Section 9(3)(d) – the allottee of  
19 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

20 (xv) Section 9(3)(e) – the allottee of  
21 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

22 (xvi) Section 9[~~(12)~~]11(b) – the allottee of  
23 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the  
24 Federated States of Micronesia;

25 (xvii) Section 9[~~(12)~~]11(f)– the allottee of

1 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

2 (xviii) Section 8(13)(t) - the allottee of

3 these funds shall be the National Olympic Committee;

4 (xix) Section 8(13)(u) - the allottee of

5 these funds shall be the Principal of Saint Cecilia

6 Catholic School;

7 (xx) Section 9[~~(12)~~]11(d) - the allottee of

8 these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional

9 Convention.

10 (xxi) Section 9[~~(12)~~]11(g) - the allottee of

11 these funds shall be the [~~Mayor of Pingelap~~] Secretary

12 of Transportation, Communications, and Infrastructure."

13 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to

14 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as

15 of September 30, 2020; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds

16 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not

17 lapse.

18 Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the

19 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its

20 becoming law without such approval.
