

TWENTY-FIRST CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 6, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172, 20-187 and 21-03, in order to appropriate \$4,838,745 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2019, to provide additional funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, various grants, subsidies and contributions, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

2 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended by
3 Public Laws Nos. 20-154, 20-159, 20-172 and 20-187 and 21-03, is
4 hereby further amended to read as follows:

5 "Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the
6 sum of \$99,791,399 from the General Fund of the Federated
7 States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September
8 30, 2019, for the purpose of funding the operations of all
9 branches of the National Government of the Federated
10 States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs,
11 grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human
12 Resources Development. The National Government's share of
13 the Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact
15 Sector Grant amount from COM-FSM and 10 percent of the
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in the
17 budget from the Department of Education. The sum
18 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

11 by this section shall be apportioned as follows:

Section 7. Section 12 of Public Law No. 20-131, as amended
by Public Law No. 20-172, is hereby further amended to read as
follows:

Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse
Dates.

(1) General provisions.

(a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in
accordance with applicable law, including, but not
limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

(b) The allottees shall be responsible for
ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be
necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in
this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess
of the sums appropriated.

(2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds
appropriated by this act are as follows:

(a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds
shall be the President of the Federated States of

1 Micronesia;

2 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds
3 shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated
4 States of Micronesia;

5 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds
6 shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the
7 Federated States of Micronesia;

8 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds
9 shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated States of
10 Micronesia;

11 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these
12 funds shall be the President of the Federated States of
13 Micronesia; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following
14 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

15 (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(8)(h) - the
16 allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint
17 Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

18 (ii) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of these
19 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

20 (iii) Section 8(9) - the allottee of these
21 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
22 Federated States of Micronesia;

23 (iv) Section 8(12)(a) - the allottee of
24 these funds shall be the President of the College of
25 Micronesia-FSM;

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1 (v) Section 8(12)(e) through (h) - the
2 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of
3 the respective State Supreme Court;

4 (vi) Section 8(12)(q) - the allottee of
5 these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint Committee on
6 Compact Review and Planning;

7 (vii) Section 9(1) - the allottee of these
8 funds shall be the President of the College of
9 Micronesia-FSM;

10 (viii) Section 9(3)(g) - the allottee of these
11 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

12 (ix) Section 9(3)(h) - the allottee of these
13 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

14 (x) Section 9(3)(i) - the allottee of these
15 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

16 (xi) Section 9(3)(j) - the allottee of these
17 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

18 (xii) Section 9(14) - the allottee of these
19 funds shall be Telecommunication Regulation Authority;

20 (xiii) Section 9(15)(a)(1) - the allottee of
21 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of
22 Kosrae;

23 (xiv) Section 9(15)(a)(2) - the allottee of
24 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of
25 Pohnpei;

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1 (xv) Section 9(15)(a)(3) - the allottee of
2 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

3 (xvi) Section 9(15)(a)(4) - the allottee of
4 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

5 (xvii) Section 9(15)(d) - the allottee of
6 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of
7 Pohnpei;

8 (xviii) Section 9(15)(e)(1) and (3) - the
9 allottee of these funds shall be the Governor of the
10 state of Chuuk;

11 (xix) Section 9(15)(e)(2) - the allottee of
12 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
13 Federated States of Micronesia.

14 (xx) Section 8(12)(y)(3) - the allottee of
15 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

16 (xxi) Section 8(12)(y)(4) - the allottee of
17 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

18 (xxii) Section 9(15)(o) - the allottee of
19 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
20 Federated States of Micronesia;

21 (xxiii) Section 9(15)(p) - the allottee of
22 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the
23 Federated States of Micronesia;

24 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to
25 obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as

1 of September 30, 2019; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds
2 appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not
3 lapse.

4 Section 8. This act shall become law upon approval by the
5 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
6 becoming law without such approval.
