## A BILL FOR AN ACT

To further amend sections 2 and 8 of Public Law No. 22-42, as amended by Public Law No. 22-60, to modify the use of funds previously appropriated therein, to fund the operations of all branches of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and contributions and Capital and Human Resources Development, and for other purposes.
